EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The United States Army Corps of Engineers, New Orleans District (CEMVN) is initiating a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) to implement construction and operation of the Henderson Water Management Unit (HMU) in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes and the recreational development feature (RDF) of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System (ABFS) in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana. The project name is the *Henderson Water Management Unit and the Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement*. This scoping report summarizes the scoping process for the SEIS and includes background on the project, developing and facilitating focus group and public scoping meetings, and analyzing public comments for use in defining the scope of the investigation. A focus group meeting with key stakeholders and state and federal agencies was held prior to the scoping meetings. Five scoping meetings were held in late July in cities surrounding the defined project area. Comments were received throughout the scoping process in the form of surveys (faxed and mailed), written comment forms, oral comments, and via the project Web site.

The comments received indicated three major issues of concern for the HMU: hydrology, environment/habitat, and environmental quality. Hydrology was a primary issue throughout the scoping process. The use, control, and function of the water control structures at the northern and southern end of the HMU was the main concern, followed by restoring the area to historic water flow patterns. The majority of the comments received regarding the water control structures are consistent with restoring the seasonal rise and fall of the water level. In addition, constructing a freshwater distribution structure to increase water flow throughout the HMU was a major concern. Habitat issues that should be considered a primary component of the SEIS are the control of invasive aquatic vegetation, protecting the native habitat (i.e., cypress-tupelo swamp), and the effects of initiating these activities. Oil and gas operations and Mercury in the ABFS are the two primary issues of environmental quality that should be evaluated in the SEIS. Other issues raised by the public included socioeconomics (primarily the effects on the fishing industry), data requirements (the need for current data in the ABFS and the HMU), funding, land ownership, and easements.

The RDF of the ABFS was divided into four major categories: boat launches, campgrounds, nature trails, and cultural centers. The comments received indicated that the need to improve existing boat launches is a greater concern to the public than constructing new boat launches. Developing and maintaining nature trails (i.e., hiking trails, wildlife viewing areas, fishing piers, all terrain vehicle [ATV] trails, and canoeing trails) were recommended throughout the ABFS. Most comments did not give specific locations for these features. A major concern that was raised by many citizens is the need for improved access for all residents and visitors throughout the basin. Conversely, several comments stated the need to reduce access to the ABFS and restrict or prohibit recreational development in an effort to keep it pristine and natural. The need for campgrounds (both primitive and developed) around the ABFS was noted several times. Also, the interest in building a cultural/interpretive center is high. Protection and promotion of cultural resources in the ABFS is regarded a high priority by some. Specifically, preserving burial grounds, historic communities, and landmarks in the ABFS and educating residents and visitors of its rich cultural history were recommended.

SECTION 1.0 INTRODUCTION

The project name is *Henderson Water Management Unit and the Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement*. The CEMVN is conducting a supplemental environmental impact statement (SEIS) to implement construction and operation of the Henderson Water Management Unit (HMU) (including the proposed freshwater distribution structure) in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes and the recreational development feature (RDF) of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System (ABFS) in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana. The CEMVN is conducting this study pursuant to the authority of the Flood Control Development Act of May 15, 1928 (Pub Law 391, 70th Congress), as amended by the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 1985, Pub Law 99-88 and as reauthorized and further amended by section 601(a) of the Water Resources Development Act of 1986 (WRDA 1986) Pub Law 99-662.

The primary goal of the management units, as stated in the ABFS, Louisiana Final EIS (1982), is to develop, as soon as possible, an implementable, multipurpose plan to protect south Louisiana from MR&T floods while retaining and restoring the unique environmental features and long-term productivity of the natural environment of the basin. To accomplish this goal, the following objectives were set forth:

- 1) To restore and preserve unique and environmental values by restoring historical overflow patterns where practical
- 2) To ensure proper water movement through the units
- 3) Where possible, restrict sediment movement and deposition in the units

The goals and objectives of the RDF of the ABFS project are:

- 1) To develop facilities such as boat launching ramps for the provision of interior and peripheral access to the ABFS project area, including lands acquired for the public access feature
- 2) To construct and operate developed and primitive campgrounds
- 3) To construct and operate an interpretative facility and other facilities complementary to the enjoyment of outdoor recreational activities, and
- 4) To facilitate utilization by the public of the fish and wildlife resources of the Lower Atchafalaya Basin Floodway. Public demand and expectations for the ABFS have increased due to an increased awareness and use of the vast ABFS natural resource, and the involvement of the CEMVN through management and part-ownership of the resources. The CEMVN will address public concerns for management of the HMU and the recreational development opportunities within the ABFS, through the SEIS.

The HMU is bounded to the north by U.S. Highway 190, to the east by the Atchafalaya River, to the south by the Butte LaRose Canal, and to the west by the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee (WABPL). The included RDF encompasses the entire area identified as the ABFS, which is bordered by U.S. Highway 190 to the north, by the protection levee to the east and west, and by the latitude of Morgan City, Louisiana to the south.

This report contains the details of the focus group meeting and the public scoping meetings, including the comments received and the analysis of those comments.

1.1 PURPOSE OF SCOPING

To prepare an SEIS effectively, the scope of the document (i.e., what will be covered and in what detail) must be determined. Planning of this kind is a required and essential component of SEIS preparation.¹ The scoping process is to be open to the public, state, tribal, and local governments and agencies. The objectives of the scoping process are as follows:

- To identify public and federal, state and local agency concerns.
- To facilitate an efficient SEIS preparation process and ascertain all the related permits and reviews that must be scheduled concurrently.
- To define the issues and alternatives that will be examined in detail in the SEIS while determining which issues are not relevant to the current investigation.
- To save time in the overall process by helping to ensure that the draft SEIS adequately addresses relevant issues, reducing the possibility that new comments will be identified late in the process causing an SEIS to be rewritten or supplemented. The overall goal of scoping is to produce an adequate and efficient SEIS.

1.2 INITIAL SCOPE OF THE ANALYSIS

In the Notice of Intent (NOI) published July 11, 2005 (see Appendix A), the CEMVN identified the study areas and region of influence of this SEIS as the HMU, including the freshwater distribution structure, and the RDF of the ABFS. The NOI stated that the SEIS for the HMU would study the authorized goal of the freshwater distribution structure and restoration of practical overflow patterns and encourage water movement through the HMU for the benefit of the aquatic environment. The goals and objectives for the ABFS RDF as stated in the NOI are the development of facilities such as boat landings, campgrounds, an interpretive center, and other facilities for the enjoyment of outdoor activities.

¹ The SEIS is being prepared in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) of 1969 (42 U.S.C. 4321 et seq.), Council on Environmental Quality (CEQ) Regulations Implementing the Procedural Provisions of the National Environmental Policy Act (40 CFR Parts 1500-1508), and CEMVN regulations for implementing NEPA (33 CFR Parts 230 and 325). The SEIS scoping process was developed on the basis of the CEQ guidance for scoping under NEPA.

The NOI also presented a list of issues to be considered for evaluation in the SEIS (Table 1-1):

CEMVN then requested input from the public and various agencies to help refine the scope to focus on the issues of greatest importance for the consideration of cumulative effects.

The following sections describe the process of soliciting public and agency input in refining the scope of the SEIS (Section 2.0), summarizes the comments received during the scoping process (Section 3.0), and describes the conclusions reached (Section 4.0). The appendices contain the information provided at the scoping meetings and the comments received.

SECTION 2.0

SCOPING PROCESS SUMMARY

The scoping process consisted of seven elements:

- Publishing an NOI in the *Federal Register*
- Distributing a Public Notice/Press Release to federal, state, tribal, and local agencies and officials, local and regional media, and other interested parties in newspapers and on radio and television stations in the region of influence
- Establishing a Web site for the dissemination of project information
- Mailing a Request for Public Comment to more than 2,225 interested individuals
- Mailing focus group invitation letters
- Conducting one focus group meeting and five public scoping meetings
- Collecting public comments (written, oral, e-mail, fax, and Web site submissions)
- Reviewing and evaluating comments received
- Developing and distributing a Scoping Report

Each of these elements is described in more detail in the following subsections.

The focus group meeting was held July 13, 2006, at the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Headquarters Building in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Participants at this meeting included representatives from various stakeholders such as environmental groups, public agencies, and private land owners. The scoping process was reviewed and a demonstration of the public scoping meetings was given. The CEMVN requested feedback and suggestions for any improvements to the meeting materials or format for the public scoping meetings.

In addition to the focus group meeting, the CEMVN conducted a series of five public scoping meetings the week of July 24–28, 2006, to solicit input and help to identify all relevant issues that should be addressed in the SEIS being prepared for the HMU and the RDF of the ABFS. This input will also be used to develop alternative methods of implementing project actions for the SEIS.

As part of the scoping meetings the CEMVN staff and the consultant team explained the NEPA process; described what recreational features the CEMVN has been authorized to construct; and provided information about the proposed alternatives for the SEIS. The primary purpose of the meetings was to solicit input and public comments on the scope of the SEIS.

2.1 PUBLIC NOTICE

The NOI to prepare an SEIS for the HMU and the RDF of the ABFS was published in the *Federal Register* on July 11, 2005 (Appendix A). It was also distributed to a wide range of news agencies and submitted to the public.

The NOI initiated the scoping process and included information pertaining to the project's region of influence, alternative scenarios, and other supplemental information supporting the CEMVN's decision to prepare the draft SEIS. In addition, the NOI identified the CEMVN as the lead federal

agency. The NOI also identified two features of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System, Louisiana Project: the HMU, which is an element of the Management Unit Feature in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes, including the freshwater distribution structure for the HMU; and the RDF in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana.

The NOI encouraged full public participation to promote open communication on the issues surrounding the proposal. All federal, state, tribal, and local agencies and other persons or organizations were urged to participate in the scoping process. Mr. Richard Boe of the New Orleans District of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Pm-RP, P.O. Box 60267, New Orleans, LA 70160, was listed as the point of contact for further information.

In April 2006, the CEMVN prepared a Web site, to further assist the public in understanding the SEIS process, (www.tetrattech-ffx.com/henderson_seis/). An e-mail address, HendersonRecSEIS@tetrattech-ffx.com, was published on the Web site for the submission of written comments.

The CEMVN issued a public notice the week of August 13, 2006, announcing the public scoping meeting for the SEIS on the HMU and RDF of the ABFS in local newspapers and on radio and television stations in the region of influence. (See Appendix B for a copy of the public notice).

2.2 FOCUS GROUP MEETING SUMMARY

The CEMVN held a focus group meeting on August 13, 2006, from 9:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. at the Louisiana Wildlife and Fisheries Headquarters Building in Baton Rouge, Louisiana. The CEMVN invited members of the public representing multiple stakeholder groups to attend a focus group meeting to discuss the scope of the SEIS. Invitations were sent out on June 26, 2006. (For a copy of the invitation and mailing list see Appendix C.)

The purpose of the focus group meeting was to solicit input on the proposed format and materials for the public scoping meetings, gather information on the issues of concern from representatives of the stakeholder groups as related to the scope and content of the SEIS, and to solicit ideas for possible alternatives to be evaluated in the SEIS.

Meeting participants were welcomed at the door, asked to sign an attendance roster, and offered a welcome packet (for copies of the welcome packet and attendance rosters see Appendices D and E respectively.) Representatives from the CEMVN and the consultant team opened the meeting with a brief presentation followed by an open house session during which participants visited each of the information booths set up around the room. Ample time was provided for discussion at each booth before the group reconvened for a moderated group discussion (To view the discussion topics see Appendix F.)

2.3 PUBLIC SCOPING MEETING

A request for public comment and announcement of the scoping meetings was sent out to a group of more than 2,225 interested individuals from around the basin on Monday, June 26, 2006. (For a copy of the request for public comment and the mailing list see Appendix G.) The scoping meetings were held the week of July 24–28, 2006, in Morgan City, Henderson, Baton Rouge, Jeanerette, and Bayou Sorrel, Louisiana. The sites were chosen in an effort to reach the broadest cross section of the public from around the entire project area. Specific locations in each city were chosen on the basis of availability, capacity, and accessibility. The times and locations of the scoping meetings are shown in Table 2-1.

The scoping meetings were held to seek input from individuals; community organizations; and federal, state, and local agencies on issues and concerns related to the operation and maintenance of the HMU and development of the RDF of the ABFS.

Meetings were conducted in an open house format, with display booths set up to help the public identify issues and concerns they thought should be addressed in the SEIS. The display booths explained issues such as the NEPA, ABFS history, hydrology, water quality, invasive aquatic vegetation, habitat, recreation, socioeconomics, and cultural resources. (For a copy of the displays see Appendix H). A welcome table was set up at the entrance to each meeting where meeting participants were asked to sign an attendance roster (for copies of the attendance rosters see Appendix I), view the meeting agenda, and take a welcome packet which included a color brochure, a public mailer, and copies of each of the booth displays (see Appendix H for these materials). Members of the CEMVN and the consultant team gave a brief introductory presentation at each meeting followed by an open house during which participants were invited to view the booth displays and discuss relevant issues with the technical staff. (For a copy of the scoping meeting presentation see Appendix J.) At the conclusion of this portion of the meeting the group reconvened for a moderated group discussion that was recorded in its entirety by a court reporter (For transcripts of each discussion see Appendix K. Please note; the discussion at Morgan City was not recorded. Therefore no transcript of this session appears in Appendix K). The technical staff at each booth gave a brief summary of the discussions from the previous hour. The moderator then asked for any additional comments from the participants regarding the topic being discussed. Following the group discussion, the consultant team and members of the CEMVN concluded the meetings and reminded participants to submit oral or written comments.

Approximately 145 people attended the meetings. Some attendees elected not to sign the rosters; therefore, not everyone who attended is included on the attendance rosters. Attendees were encouraged to submit written comments by August 24, 2006, to the HMU/ABFS RDF SEIS Project Office, P.O. Box 2188, Baton Rouge, Louisiana, 70802. Appendices L and M contain copies of all written and oral comments received.

SECTION 3.0

SCOPING COMMENTS

The scoping process resulted in the submission of comments from approximately 167 individuals and organizations. The comments received were submitted to the CEMVN by mail, e-mail, comment forms provided at the scoping meeting, and to the court reporter at the scoping meetings. The comments received are contained in Appendices L (Written Comments) and M (Oral Comments). This section discusses the process of reviewing, organizing, and analyzing those comments.

3.1 REVIEW AND ORGANIZATION OF SCOPING COMMENTS

Written comments were submitted in two formats: surveys (see Appendix G) that were distributed by mail and at the scoping meetings, and letters or e-mails with general comments. (For copies of all written comments submitted to the CEMVN as of August 24, 2006, see Appendix L.) The survey forms returned to the CEMVN contained responses to 8 primary issues and 27 sub-issues. Respondents were asked to rate each primary issue and sub-issue on a scale of 1–5, 1 being not at all important, 5 being extremely important. Each comment was assigned a numeric code, entered into a database and carefully reviewed. Each issue and sub-issue that was rated as 4 or 5 was categorized as important. Those responses were tallied to determine the relative importance of each primary issue and sub-issue. After the initial review of the objective portion of the survey, written and oral comments were evaluated to determine issues of specific concern. (For transcripts of all oral comments see Appendix M.) As a result, 213 specific concerns and 123 specific locations for recreation features were identified. (For a list of these issues and locations, see Appendices N and O respectively.)

Several issues were identified that are not recommended to be analyzed in the SEIS. These issues may be addressed in cumulative effects or in other NEPA documents; are activities that extend beyond the operational and maintenance activities the CEMVN is required to perform by law; or are beyond the project boundaries. Following is a list of those issues identified in the scoping process that will not be analyzed in this SEIS:

- **Recreational features beyond project boundaries.** Several boat landings, hiking and canoeing trails, and visitor centers were recommended for construction or improvements outside of the ABFS boundary.
- **Eagle Point Park.** The proposed Eagle Point Park, a developed campsite, is not included in this SEIS as an ABFS RDF; however, it is anticipated that Eagle Point Park will be approved in the future. If it is approved, the boundary of the RDF of the ABFS will be extended to include the park and development will be investigated according to NEPA regulations.
- **Extension of the Jeanerette Canal.** The extension of the Jeanerette Canal to Bayou Teche was recommended multiple times. However, it is outside of the geographic boundaries of this project.
- **False River.** Improving water quality and flooding problems in False River falls outside the project boundary.

Please note that the comment analysis in the following sections (see Table 3-1 and Figures 3-2, 3-6, 3-7, and 3-8) includes 36 comments that pertain strictly to a recreation project outside of the project boundaries as defined in this document. It is possible that the project boundaries may change in the future to include this area; therefore, these comments have been included in the analysis.

3.2 COMMENTS (PRIMARY ISSUES)

Table 3-1 lists the primary issues and the sub-issues addressed in the survey and the number of respondents who indicated that each was important to them (4 or 5 on the 1–5 scale).




Figure 3-1. Relative importance of HMU issues.




Figure 3-2. Relative importance of ABFS recreation issues.

The relative importance of each of the primary issues related to the HMU and the RDF of the ABFS are illustrated in Figures 3-1 and 3-2 respectively. Environmental quality, habitat, and hydrology were rated important by approximately the same number of survey respondents. Socioeconomics was rated important by significantly fewer survey respondents. However, socioeconomics may be misrepresented in these statistics given that many of the sub-issues for the former three categories relate directly to this issue. For example, many commercial fishermen rated hydrology and dredging as important issues. Their ability to continue their business (a socioeconomic issue) is dependent on management decisions related to hydrology.

Boat launches were rated the most important issue related to the RDF of the ABFS. Campgrounds and nature trails were rated similarly to one another, and cultural centers were rated important by the fewest number of survey respondents.

3.3 COMMENTS (SUB-ISSUES)

This section describes the relative importance of each sub-issue evaluated in the survey.

3.3.1 Hydrology




Figure 3-3. Relative importance of hydrology sub-issues.

Figure 3-3 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of hydrology. The sub-issue of restoring the HMU to its historic hydrologic conditions was considered an important issue by 70 percent of those survey respondents who indicated that hydrology was important. Of that same group, 59 percent and 72 percent indicated that dredging and control structures are important sub-issues, respectively.

3.3.2 Environmental Quality




Figure 3-4. Relative importance of environmental quality sub-issue.

Figure 3-4 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of environmental quality. The sub-issue of oil and gas operations was considered an important issue by 54 percent of those survey respondents who indicated that environmental quality was important. Of that same group, 91 percent indicated that water quality was an important sub-issue.

3.3.3 Habitat




Figure 3-5. Relative importance of habitat sub-issues.

Figure 3-5 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of habitat. The three sub-issues were rated as relatively similar in their importance by respondents who indicated that habitat was an important issue. Eighty percent indicated that invasive aquatic vegetation is important; 85 percent indicated that habitat conservation and restoration is important; and 81 percent indicated that wildlife is important.

3.3.4 Socioeconomics

Only a small fraction of respondents who indicated that socioeconomics is important rated the sub-issues. (see Table 3-1.) Because the data on these sub-issues was not statistically significant, the sub-issues will be treated as part of the primary issue and each will be regarded as important for purposes of this analysis. Forty-seven percent of survey respondents indicated that socioeconomics is an important issue.

3.3.5 Boat Launches




Figure 3-6. Relative importance of boat launches sub-issues.

Figure 3-6 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of boat launches. Fifty-four percent of people who indicated that boat launches are important rated improvements to existing launches as important. However, 32 percent of that same group also rated new launches as an important part of recreational development in the ABFS.

3.3.6 Campgrounds




Figure 3-7. Relative importance of campground sub-issues.

Figure 3-7 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of campgrounds. Of the people who rated campgrounds as an important RDF in the basin, 34 percent indicated that primitive campgrounds are important and 45 percent indicated that developed campgrounds are important.

3.3.7 Nature Trails




Figure 3-8. Relative importance of nature trail sub-issues.

Figure 3-8 illustrates the relative importance of each sub-issue under the primary issue of nature trails. The responses to the sub-issues for nature trails was fairly evenly distributed with 48 percent of respondents indicating that hiking trails are important and 41 percent of respondents indicating that paddling trails are important.

3.3.8 Cultural Center

There were no sub-issues for this topic.

3.4 COMMON ISSUES OF CONCERN

Following the analysis of the responses gathered from the surveys, a detailed analysis of all written and oral comments was conducted (see Appendix N). All specific issues were identified and put into one of 7 categories related to the HMU: hydrology, habitat, water quality, data requirements, socioeconomics, land ownership and easements, and funding and CEMVN responsibilities; or one of two topics related to the RDF: recreation, and cultural resources and public education. A total of 213 specific issues within the nine categories described above were identified and evaluated for inclusion in the SEIS. Each of the 9 categories is described below.

3.4.1 Henderson Water Management Unit

Hydrology (65 issues)

The topic of hydrology received the highest number of written and oral comments. The issues in this category fell into one of the following eight categories: use of the water control structures at northern and southern ends of the HMU for improvement of water quality; restoration of natural water flow patterns (wet and dry cycles); reduction of sediment deposition; introduction of freshwater into the HMU through pumps, other water control structures, or existing structures; increasing water flow throughout the HMU by decreasing the height of existing spoil banks (or cutting channels through them); opposition to the construction of any additional spoil banks; the need for water to flow north to south; and clearing existing channels for navigation.

Habitat (45 issues)

Six categories were identified in the written and oral comments related to habitat: protection of the cypress–tupelo swamps, health of the fish populations in the basin, impacts to the forests/timber industry, protection of wildlife, restoration of native species, and control/eradication of invasive aquatic vegetation. Nearly 60 percent of the comments in this category related to the control of invasive aquatic vegetation, with the majority of those comments being about hydrilla. Most people indicated a strong preference to use methods other than chemical control for hydrilla. Several comments also noted the presence (or growing problem) of water hyacinth and giant salvinia.

Water Quality (15 issues)

The comments in this category related to two major topics: Mercury in the ABFS and oil and gas operations. It was noted several times that oil and gas operations should be required to directionally drill and mark or remove abandoned well sites (e.g., pipes, platforms).

Data Requirements (8 issues)

Data requirement issues were an important subject throughout the scoping process. The majority of the comments received relate to determining present conditions of the area (e.g., habitat, hydrology, species populations) as well as the length of time that existing data are viable.

Socioeconomics (6 issues)

Socioeconomics comprises the social, economic, and demographic characteristics of a region. The socioeconomic analysis will update the social and economic changes that have occurred in

the region since the 1982 EIS was prepared. Most comments received regarding socioeconomics indicated that residents of the basin are concerned about how the management of the area will affect the local businesses (primarily the fishing industry) and the way of life in the Atchafalaya Basin.

Land Ownership and Easements (10 issues)

The two major issues within this category were the potential impacts of private land ownership and management decisions for the ABFS on one another and the need for permanent conservation easements.

Funding/CEMVN Responsibilities (11 issues)

The majority of the comments on this topic indicate that the public wants to know where the funding will come from, the CEMVN's responsibility of maintaining their projects, and publication of a list of ongoing and planned CEMVN projects. Comments also indicated an interest in forming a single decision-making group for management of the ABFS to avoid the conflicting interests of individual groups.

3.4.2 Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System

Recreation (44 issues)

The comments related to recreation were both for and against additional recreational development in the ABFS. Many commenters have made suggestions for specific locations for features; some simply stated their support for recreational development, and others noted the need to limit development in an effort to keep the basin natural and pristine. Many people raised the issue of accessibility in the ABFS as an important issue to be addressed in the SEIS, noting that many areas are difficult or impossible for the elderly or physically impaired to reach. Safety at a few specific boat launches was also indicated as an accessibility issue that should be addressed. Increasing the signage around the ABFS for safety and educational purposes was also a common interest.

Cultural Resources and Public Education (9 issues)

Most of the comments in this category fell into two main groups: preservation of burial grounds/mounds and education of local and national populations about the rich natural and cultural history of the basin. Other comments suggested specific projects for consideration.

SECTION 4.0 CONCLUSIONS

The CEMVN has completed its formal scoping process for the SEIS for the Henderson Water Management Unit and the recreation development feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System. Recognizing that scoping is an iterative process, CEMVN will continue to give due consideration to all relevant input received throughout the development of the SEIS. Coordination with regulatory agencies and the public will continue. Following the publication of this scoping report, the draft SEIS is planned for publication and public review in winter 2007.

A total of 167 public comments were submitted to the CEMVN by mail, e-mail, comment forms provided at the scoping meeting, and to the court reporter at the scoping and focus group meetings. Each comment was carefully reviewed and synthesized into 9 categories of common issues, as previously described in Section 3.1.

As a result of the focus group and public scoping meetings, issues relevant to the SEIS were verified and clearly defined. The overwhelming majority of written and oral comments indicated that recreation, hydrology, and habitat are the three most important categories of issues to be included in this investigation. These three categories represent 73 percent of all written and oral comments submitted (21 percent, 31 percent, and 21 percent respectively). These issues should be the primary focus of the SEIS. The other issues addressed in this document should also be examined. A draft Description of the Proposed Action and Alternatives (DOPAA) that more clearly states CEMVN's intended action, the purpose of and need for that action, and alternatives to implement the action will be developed based on the issues verified during the scoping process. The DOPAA will be included in the SEIS.

SUMMARY: The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, New Orleans District (CEMVN) is initiating a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) for the Henderson Lake Management Unit feature, including the freshwater distribution structure element, of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project, pursuant to the authority of the Flood Control Act of May 15, 1928 (Pub. L. 391, 70th Congress); and for the Recreational Development feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System, Louisiana project (hereinafter "ABFS" project), pursuant to the authority of the Flood Control Act of May 15, 1928 (Pub. L. 391, 70th Congress), as amended by the Supplemental Appropriations Act of 1985, Pub. L. 99-88 and as reauthorized and further amended by Section 601(a) of the Water Resources Development

Act of 1986 (WRDA 1986), Pub. L. 99-662.

The CEMVN is initiating this study to implement construction and operation of the Henderson Lake Management Unit, St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes, which is one of two authorized pilot management units for the Management Unit feature of the ABFS Project; the freshwater distribution structure element, of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes, Louisiana; and the Recreational Development feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System, Louisiana project in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana. The authorized goals of the Management Unit feature of the ABFS project are to improve water quality and interior water circulation; remove barriers to reestablish north to south water flow; provide input of oxygenated low temperature water; and reduce or manage sediment input into the interior swamp. Action is necessary due to the existing poor water quality resulting from the lack of internal circulation and oxygenated water inputs, and increased sedimentation. In addition if action is not taken, both deep-water and shallow water habitat utilized by fish and wildlife resources will continue to be lost, reduced, or degraded. The intended result of the proposed work is to prolong the life expectancy of the productive habitat (primarily aquatic and cypress tupelo habitats) by restricting or redirecting sediments, while simultaneously achieving a healthy water circulation pattern that would maintain or restore water quality and reestablish north to south water movement. The Henderson Lake Management Unit is hydrologically separate and independent from the Buffalo Cove, Flat Lake, Cocodrie Swamp and Beau Bayou Management Unit elements of the ABFS project.

The authorized goal of the freshwater distribution structure element, of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project is to provide water inflow to the Henderson Lake area and, together with the Henderson Lake Management Unit, restore overflow patterns to the extent practicable, and to encourage water movement through the Henderson Lake Management Unit for the benefit of the aquatic environment.

The goals and objectives of the Recreational Development feature of the ABFS project are the development of facilities such as boat launching ramps for the provision of interior and peripheral access to the ABFS project area, including those lands acquired for the Public Access feature of the ABFS

project, as well as the construction and operation of developed and primitive campgrounds, an interpretive facility and other facilities complementary to the enjoyment of outdoor recreational activities for the observation and utilization by the public of the fish and wildlife resources of the Lower Atchafalaya Basin Floodway. Public demand and expectations for the ABFS have increased due to an increased awareness and use of the vast ABFS natural resource, and the involvement of the CEMVN through management and part-ownership of the resource. The CEMVN will address public concerns for management of the Henderson Lake Management Unit, and recreational development opportunities within the ABFS, through an SEIS.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION:

1. *Proposed Action.* Under the proposed action the existing project will be investigated to identify and evaluate possible alternatives for the freshwater distribution structure element of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project, the Henderson Lake Management Unit, and the Recreational Development feature of the ABFS project.

A. Henderson Lake Management Unit: The Henderson Lake Management Unit represents one of two pilot management units authorized by WRDA 1986 for the Management Unit feature of the ABFS Project in accordance with the Atchafalaya Basin Feasibility Study and the accompanying Environmental Impact Statement dated January 1982, as approved by the Report of the Chief of Engineers dated February 28, 1983. Because the Henderson Lake Management Unit constitutes one of the "pilot" management units for the Management Unit feature of the ABFS project, the SEIS will clearly identify the possibility that additional future work may be recommended in the Henderson Lake Management Unit if the analysis of the operational monitoring data supports a finding that the Henderson Lake Management Unit elements initially proposed in the 1982 EIS for construction do not fully accomplish the goals and objectives of the authorized Management Unit feature of the ABFS project. The Henderson Lake Management Unit is hydrologically separate and independent from the

other pilot management unit (Buffalo Cove Management Unit) and from the three conditionally authorized management units, Cocodrie Swamp, Flat Lake and Beau Bayou. Additionally, the management unit objectives, public interests and concerns that will be addressed at the Henderson Lake Management Unit differ substantially from those present for the other management units at Buffalo Cove, Flat Lake, Cocodrie Swamp and Beau Bayou. As such, Buffalo Cove, Flat Lake, Cocodrie Swamp and Beau Bayou will be the subject of a separate SEIS.

B. The development of the freshwater distribution structure element, of the Henderson Lake Area will serve as a source of freshwater for the Henderson Lake Management Unit which, with the implementation of the Henderson Lake Management Unit, will restore overflow patterns to the extent practicable and encourage water movement within the Henderson Lake Management Unit area for the benefit of the aquatic environment.

C. The development of the Recreational Development feature of the ABFS project will include, but is not limited to; campgrounds for recreational vehicles, tent, and primitive camping; paddling, hiking and biking trails; interpretive trails; bird watching facilities; boat launches; a project visitor center; and certain special and unique areas. These facilities will accommodate and support public-use in the ABFS, provide for additional entry into the ABFS to access its resources, and protect and aide in interpreting specific environmentally and culturally significant resources. The proposals for the freshwater distribution structure element of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project, the Recreational Development feature of the ABFS project and the Henderson Lake Management Unit element of the Management Unit feature of the ABFS project are being investigated in the same document because the operation of the Henderson Lake Management Unit will have an impact on the nature and scope of recreational development that can take place in the area affected by the Henderson Lake Management Unit.

2. *Alternatives.* The alternative formulation process for the Henderson Lake Management Unit of the ABFS project and the freshwater distribution structure element of the Henderson Lake Area Atchafalaya Basin, Louisiana project will include, but shall not be limited to, an evaluation of the "no action alternative", the original structural alternative plan as proposed in the 1982 Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System, Louisiana Final Environmental

Impact Statement and Feasibility Study, and other alternatives, such as dredging, lake draw downs, and spraying of vegetation, including hydrilla and hyacinth, for the regulation of water distribution, the improvement of water quality and interior water circulation, and the restoration, to the extent possible, of overflow patterns in the Henderson Lake Management Unit area. Alternative recreational features for the ABFS would be various combinations of the proposed action recreation feature. The alternatives analysis for all of these elements will continue to evolve throughout the development of the SEIS.

3. *Scoping.* Scoping is the process for determining the scope of alternatives and significant issues to be addressed in the SEIS. For this analysis, a letter will be sent to all parties believed to have an interest in the analysis, requesting their input on alternatives and issues to be evaluated. The letter will also notify interested parties of public scoping meetings that will be held in the local area. Notices will also be sent to local news media. All interested parties are invited to comment at this time, and anyone interested in this study should request to be included in the study mailing list.

Public scoping meetings will be held in the vicinity of Lafayette, St. Martinville, and Baton Rouge, Louisiana. Depending on public interest, and if further public coordination is warranted, additional meetings may be scheduled.

4. *Significant Issues.* The tentative list of resources and issues to be evaluated in the SEIS includes wetlands (marshes and swamps), aquatic resources, commercial and recreational fisheries, wildlife resources, water quality, air quality, threatened and endangered species, recreation resources, and cultural resources. Socioeconomic items to be evaluated in the SEIS include navigation, flood protection, business and industrial activity, employment, land use, property values, public/community facilities and services, tax revenues, population, community and regional growth, transportation, housing, community cohesion, and noise.

5. *Environmental Consultation and Review.* The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) will be assisting in the documentation of existing conditions and assessment of effects of project alternatives through Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act consultation procedures. The USFWS will provide a Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act report. The CEMVN will consult with the USFWS concerning threatened and

endangered species and their critical habitat. The CEMVN will notify all interested agencies, organizations, and individuals as to availability of a draft SEIS for review. The CEMVN will coordinate with the Natural Resources Conservation Service for prime and unique farmlands. The CEMVN will coordinate with the Advisory Counsel on Historic Preservation and the State Historic Preservation Officer. The CEMVN will coordinate with the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources regarding consistency with the Coastal Zone Management Act. The CEMVN will contact the Louisiana Department of Wildlife and Fisheries concerning potential impacts to Natural and Scenic Rivers and Streams. The Louisiana Department of Environmental Quality will review the action for consistency with applicable laws regarding the discharge of dredged material as it relates to impacting water quality and will provide the State of Louisiana Water Quality Certification.

Atchafalaya meetings: water quality, recreation

Meetings begin Monday on Henderson Unit's water quality and basin recreation

NEW ORLEANS – Citizens are invited to a series of public meetings beginning Monday on improving water quality in the sprawling Henderson Lake area of Louisiana's famed Atchafalaya Basin and on reassessing recreation through the 595,000-acre basin.

The first of five meetings will be held Monday, July 24 in Morgan City, at the Morgan City Auditorium, Highway 182 and Myrtle Street. The full list of meetings, dates and locations is attached.

The meetings concern the construction and operation of the Henderson Water Management Unit, the second water quality project of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Project. The meetings will also focus on reassessing the recreational features of the ABFS project.

“These will be scoping meetings, in which the public is asked to present concerns and facts to help the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers determine the full scope of considerations necessary to achieve these goals and to frame a supplemental environmental impact statement,” said Project Manager Mark Wingate.

At 80,000 acres, the Henderson Water Management Unit is five times the size of Henderson Lake that it embraces. The unit is bounded on the north by U.S. 190 at Krotz Springs, on the east by the Atchafalaya River, on the south by the Butte La Rose Canal and on the west by the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee.

Written and oral comments concerning issues to be addressed in the SEIS will be taken at the scoping meetings. A court reporter will record oral comments. In addition, you may submit written questions or comments using the following methods. The deadline for submitting written comments is Aug. 24, 2006.





Water Management Units were developed to mimic historical water overflow patterns as much as practical, improve water circulation throughout the units, restrict sediment movement thereby reducing deposition, and supply nutrients and organic matter to the estuarine areas downstream. The HMU is bounded to the north by U.S. Hwy 190, the east by the Atchafalaya River, the south by the Butte LaRose Canal, and the west by the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee (see Figure 1). The proposed freshwater distribution structure feature of the HMU project is an integral element to the overall HMU project. The development of a freshwater distribution structure for the HMU will serve as a possible source of freshwater to help restore overflow patterns to the extent practicable and encourage water circulation and movement within the HMU area for fish and wildlife enhancement. It should also benefit the aquatic environment. Figure 1. Henderson Water Management Unit





Figure 2. Atchafalaya Basin Recreational Features



Hydrology

- How/where will the water enter Henderson Lake?
- How will the water be moved?
- What kind of gates will be used?
- How will distribution be handled?

- Need to quantify the amount of water being diverted.
 - 3,000 cubic feet per second
- The difference in elevation between the north and south control structures should be enough to move the water
- Operation of the north and south control structures must be coordinated
- Water should be let in at a lower elevation
- The southern control structure is on private property - management decision must account for that factor
- Water should be diverted from the northern control structure down the west protection levee
- The west guide levee should be improved by dredging to accomplish better distribution
- The impacts of any proposed action on the existing spoil banks or the construction of new spoil banks must be considered
- Consider access issues where private land is involved
- Improvements to canals/outlets should be considered
- Consider creating additional deeper water

Invasive Aquatic Species

- Hydrilla is by far the biggest concern in Henderson
- Landowners need relief during low water periods
- It is expected that the Boulevard will be lowered in 2007 — if that happens dredging will be needed for boat access
- Draw-downs must be done consistently (will not be a successful solution if it is done as a one-time event)
- Over a million dollars has already been spent on Hydrilla control; need a lasting solution and the Corps has to do their part to achieve this goal
- Elevation of the water is the key factor
- The tubers for Hydrilla can survive for several years
- Draw-down is part of the normal cycle in the basin, it is actually good for fish and habitat
- Draw-down can be disturbed by rain; it's not a 100% success guarantee
- A guarantee for consistent funding from the State is need for Hydrilla control
- The Henderson Lake Advisory Committee could be an ally
- From the perspective of the residents, conditions were much better before the control structures were installed — evidence that management decisions should be modeled after natural processes

- Hydrilla will not be eliminated, but the problem can be alleviated by actively managing the water control structures to mimic nature
- More outlets to the river are needed (this would allow fish in to spawn and would alleviate the problem of low dissolved oxygen) — water must be able to flow freely in and out of the lake
- There is a growing problem with Giant Salvinia
- This is the *most important* issue for the Henderson area

Habitat

- What is being done to regenerate the Cypress/Tupelo swamps?
- What will be the positive and negative effects of raising and lowering the water on wildlife and fisheries?
- Before the Corps bought the land, reforestation was approved, then it was not allowed. Last year the Corps approved a small project. A plan is in the works, however, the primary problem so far has been theft of the seedlings that have been planted.
- The islands/flats are so degraded that all that's left is the root systems of the trees that were there....the flats should be improved with the dredged material.
- Native species should be used to battle invasives

Water Quality

- Where does the mercury come from?
- Where is the agricultural runoff coming from and what exactly are its effects?
- Litter is a big problem

NEPA

- Will there be an opportunity to review the document before December 2007?
- Environmental/regulatory compliance for state-conducted draw-down, effects of the SEIS

Socioeconomics

- Land ownership is a major issue — private landowners should be consulted early
- State water bottoms
- ALL these issues affect tourism/recreation/fishing/farming etc.. .they're all socioeconomic issues
- Henderson is a natural location for major bass runs but they can't get out freely
- Need to link the big picture — openings from the Atchafalaya River for water quality/fishing/habitat — major overlaps. The hydrology must be restored to mimic former conditions.
- A single issue approach will invariably lead to a “blinders issue”
- What is missing from this analysis is an assessment of the current conditions.
- A listing of all conditions and expected changes associated with each management scenario is needed
- It would be useful to give the public access to this assessment — general concepts, prospects, impacts (not the detailed analysis of scenarios that will be in the SEIS)
- Get as much info to the scoping meetings as possible to get public support

- The Corps' responsibility is to test these options and present findings to the public as they become available, including an explanation of the screening process
- There is a lot of information available on water quality and invasive species, why not provide that as a resource for public education? (not just a suggestion for these scoping meetings, but for future EISes)
- NATURE controls everything, the gates are important even if they need improvement
 - It would be valuable for people to understand the science behind these scenarios to make informed decisions using non-biased, scientific assessments of the conditions
- We're trying to get new benefits from the old flood control project — this is a good thing but we need to remember that the best way to do that is to mimic nature and keep in mind the overall purpose

Recreation

- A number of sites were identified as problems or opportunities
- There is a significant need for fishing piers
- Suggestion for a canoe input (possible at Little Bayou Sorrel)
- Interest in wildlife viewing areas
- There is a concern over land ownership, how will development affect the private landowners?
- Rebuild the bridge in Butte La Rose
- Install rest rooms at boat landings
- Suggestion to restore Big Alabama
 - This is already being done — construction will be underway within the year
- Install a siphon in the Atchafalaya River at Big Alabama
- The Corps should buy additional land to improve access.

Cultural Resources

- Debate over whether the burial mounds should be moved or kept in place with additional security measures
 - Question about whether the mounds could interfere with flow if kept in place
- Debate over draining versus not draining
- There are other burial mounds at Butte La Rose and other locations — why does this one need to affect what happens in the entire basin?
- Before the gates were installed they were exposed
- It doesn't seem like this issue should stop management of the whole area — need to find a way to proceed with management and effectively protect the burial mounds.
- With approval to move the artifacts, it may be possible to ensure that the area remains sacred by treating it the same as other cemeteries with the use of signs stating that the remains have been moved to deter anyone who might otherwise try to disturb them
- There are about 1,000 acres in control of the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana. Not every burial ground is within those 1,000 acres and because of that there has been insufficient protection for those that lie outside
- The Tribe is trying to determine the size of the area, the best method of protection and is working closely with the Corps to achieve these goals. The concern is simply to protect the sacred grounds that are important to their heritage.
- The Corps has offered land for relocation

- Southern Louisiana doesn't have the same "valuable" artifacts found at locations in other parts of the country
- Each site is recorded, but that is not public information because of the risk of looting. It is given out on a strictly need to know basis

General

- We need some type of committee with all of the stakeholders for decision-making
- Better communication is needed — right hand not always talking to the left
- Certain circumstances require *immediate* action
 - The permitting process takes time and can/has resulted in negative effects that could be avoided if a process for making immediate decisions was in place.
- This group (stakeholder committee) may be outside of the SEIS effort
- Need a management plan for joint control of the two control structures
- St. Martin Parish has to depend on state and federal agencies for input to control the southern structure.
- Why can't the scoping process include an operation and management (O&M) plan?
- Assume the plan includes the new structures, it will have an O&M plan, but that doesn't mean there is any reason not to go ahead with the formation of the stakeholder group now.
- There is an O&M plan for the north structure
- What happens after the scoping meetings?
- Will there be any post-public scoping meeting focus group meetings?
- After the scoping meetings the Corps will take the information gathered and begin shaping a plan
- Will there be interim meetings?
- Will there be meetings north of Route 190?

Background

In 1982, the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers New Orleans District (CEMVN) conducted an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System (ABFS). Two of the major components of this EIS were the recreational development feature and the water management feature. The water management feature included an element specific to the Henderson Water Management Unit (HMU) (see below). The CEMVN is now conducting a Supplemental EIS (SEIS) to update the evaluation of these two features as part of the effort to restore historic hydrologic conditions to the HMU and to assess the changing needs of recreational users of the entire ABFS. The CEMVN is investigating these two components as part of the same document because the operation of the HMU will have an effect on the nature and scope of recreational development that can take place in the area of the ABFS affected by the HMU.

Project Summary

The CEMVN designed this investigation to determine the most effective way to implement the construction of water control features, the operation of the HMU, and the Recreational Development Feature of the ABFS. In the ABFS, the HMU is located in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes, and the Recreational Development Feature will be developed in the Atchafalaya Basin in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana. Throughout the development of the Henderson SEIS, the CEMVN will address public comments regarding the management of the HMU and the recreational development opportunities within the ABFS. The SEIS will analyze alternative plans and evaluate environmental impacts associated with the two projects. The draft version of this document is expected to be available for public review in December 2007.

Henderson Management Unit Project Summary

The Henderson Management Unit represents one of two pilot management units authorized by the Water Resource Development Act of 1986. Water management units were developed to mimic historical water overflow patterns as much as practical; improve water circulation throughout the units; restrict sediment movement thereby reducing deposition; and supply nutrients and organic matter to the estuarine areas downstream. The HMU is bounded to the north by U.S. Hwy 190, to the east by the Atchafalaya River, to the south by the Butte LaRose Canal, and to the west by the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee. The proposed freshwater distribution structure feature is an integral element to the overall HMU project. Developing a freshwater distribution structure for the HMU will serve as a possible source of freshwater to help restore overflow patterns, to the extent practicable; encourage water circulation and movement within the HMU area for fish and wildlife enhancement; and benefit the aquatic environment. The HMU project will address other important issues such as invasive aquatic species (*hydrilla* and *hyacinth*), operation and maintenance of existing water control structures, dredging projects, and recreational facilities. **The CEMVN is asking the public to provide input and potential alternatives related to the HMU.**


Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Summary

Public demand and expectations for the ABFS have increased due to an increased awareness and use of the vast ABFS natural resources and the CEMVN's involvement through management and part-ownership of the resource.

The focus of the recreational development feature of the ABFS project will include, but is not limited to building campgrounds for recreational vehicles, tent, and primitive camping; establishing paddling, hiking and biking trails; interpretive trails; erecting bird watching facilities; building or improving boat launches; creating a project visitor center; and performing other work in certain special and unique areas. 
The U.S. Army Corps of Engineers New Orleans District (CEMVN) is initiating a study to implement construction and operation of the Henderson Water Management Unit (HMU) (see page 2) and the Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System (ABFS) (see page 3). The HMU is within the ABFS in St. Martin and St. Landry Parishes, and the Recreational Development Feature of the ABFS will take place in St. Martin, Iberia, St. Mary, Iberville, St. Landry, and Pointe Coupee Parishes, Louisiana. The CEMVN will address public concerns for management of the HMU and the recreational development opportunities within the ABFS through a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS). The SEIS will analyze alternative plans and evaluate environmental impacts associated with the two projects. The SEIS is scheduled to be published in December 2007.

The Recreational Development feature of the ABFS project and the HMU element of the Water Management Feature of the ABFS 1982 Environmental Impact Statement are being investigated in the same document because the operation of the HMU will affect the nature and scope of recreational development that can take place in the area impacted by the HMU.

The first step in the SEIS process is to solicit public comments and alternatives. This is an important step in the overall success of the project. This process is required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), and is referred to as Scoping. Henderson Management Unit Project Summary

The Henderson Management Unit (HMU) represents one of two pilot management units authorized by the Water Resource Development Act of 1986. Water Management Units were developed to mimic historical water overflow patterns as much as practical, improve water circulation throughout the units, restrict sediment movement thereby reducing deposition, and supply nutrients and organic matter to the estuarine areas downstream. The HMU is bounded to the north by U.S. Hwy 190, the east by the Atchafalaya River, the south by the Butte LaRose Canal, and the west by the West Atchafalaya Basin Protection Levee (see Figure 1). The proposed freshwater distribution structure feature of the HMU project is an integral element to the overall HMU project. The development of a freshwater distribution structure for the HMU will serve as a possible source of freshwater to help restore overflow patterns to the extent practicable and encourage water circulation and movement within the HMU area for fish and wildlife enhancement. It should also benefit the aquatic environment. Other important issues that will be addressed by the HMU project will be invasive aquatic species (*Hydrilla* and *Hyacinth*); operation and maintenance of existing water control structures; dredging projects; and recreation facilities.

Figure 1. Henderson Water Management Unit





Figure 2. Atchafalaya Basin Recreational Features



Recreational Development Feature of the Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System Summary

Public demand and expectations for the ABFS have increased due to an increased awareness and use of the vast ABFS natural resources and the involvement of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers through management and part-ownership of the resource.

The focus of the recreational development feature of the ABFS project will include, but is not limited to building campgrounds for recreational vehicles, tent, and primitive camping; establishing paddling, hiking and biking trails; interpretive trails; erecting bird watching facilities; building or improving boat launches; creating a project visitor center; and performing other work in certain special and unique areas. These recreational facilities will accommodate and support the public's use in the ABFS; provide for additional entry into the ABFS to access its resources; and protect and aid in interpreting specific environmentally and culturally significant resources.


Atchafalaya Basin Floodway System History



- The ABFS, the largest and last great river-basin swamp in North America, comprises an area of ~595,000 acres of channels, bayous, swamps, and lakes. It is approximately 15 miles from east to west and 150 miles north to south.
- The Great Flood of 1927 prompted Congress to pass The Flood Control Act of 1928, committing the Federal Government to a definite program of flood control.
- Major levee construction began in 1928 and continues today. The ABFS includes ~449 miles of guide levees, excluding the Morganza Floodway.
- The Wax Lake Outlet Channel was completed in 1941, providing a second outlet for the Atchafalaya Basin, outputting about 30% of the water through the ABFS.
- The Old River Control Structure, completed in 1963, was built by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) to maintain the water distribution between the Mississippi and Atchafalaya Rivers at 70% and 30%, respectively.
- In 1969, the National Environmental Policy Act was passed, requiring Environmental Impact Statements (EIS) to be completed for major federal actions that could impact the human environment.
- In January 1982, the ABFS EIS was completed, and was then approved by the Office of the Chief of Engineers in February of 1983.
- Congress passed The Water Resource Development Act (WRDA) of 1986 authorizing 250 million (M) dollars for the USACE to preserve and enhance the ABFS by expanding public access, environmental easements, water management, and recreation.
- In late 1986, an Auxiliary Control Structure was placed in service in the vicinity of the Old River Control Structure.
- The USACE has purchased approximately \$97 M worth of land acquisitions in the ABFS since 1986, including approximately 50,000 acres in fee title and 110,000 acres of easements.

Cultural Resources

Federal Regulation of Cultural Resources

Section 106 of the *National Historic Preservation Act* requires federal agencies (e.g., U.S. Army Corps of Engineers) to take into account the effects of their undertakings on historic properties and afford the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation a reasonable opportunity to comment on such undertakings.

The steps in the Section 106 process are as follows:

1. Initiate 106.
 - a) Establish if there is an undertaking
 - b) Identify the appropriate State/Tribal Historic Preservation Office
 - c) Involve the public
 - d) Identify other consulting parties
 - e) Develop a broad range of alternatives

2. If historic properties might be affected, identify them.

Historic property means any prehistoric or historic district, site, building, structure, or object included in, or eligible for inclusion in, the National Register of Historic Places (NRHP) maintained by the Secretary of the Interior such as:

- Artifacts, records, and remains that are related to and located within such properties support the NRHP significance of that property.
- Traditional Cultural Places (TCPs): TCPs are sites that reflect traditional religions, beliefs, customs, and practices and are placed in the NRHP under Criterion A (see below).

To be eligible for the NRHP, the property must be 50 years of age, meet one or more of the following four criteria and possess integrity of location, design, setting, materials, workmanship, feeling, and association.

Criterion A: Association with events (can be a building or landscape, such as a battlefield or a TCP). TCPs usually fall into this category because the property is associated with past events important to a certain community.

Criterion B: Association with people (can be a building or a landscape/cityscape).

Criterion C: Distinctive design/construction (architecture, buildings, structures, or objects). Very few buildings greater than 50 years of age survive in the basin.

Criterion D: Research potential (archeological sites with interesting artifacts and features that can tell us something important about history or prehistory).



Henderson Lake contains such sites including:

- Civil war sites (e.g., Butte La Rose)
- Prehistoric (Native American) sites (the Henderson Lake Site)
- Sites of businesses and communities, such as the town site of Atchafalaya

3. If historic properties will be affected, apply the criteria of adverse effect. An undertaking is adverse if it:

- Alters characteristics that qualify the property for the National Register
- Diminishes the property's integrity

Indirect (raising water levels) or direct (excavating for structure or levee) actions apply.

4. If there is an adverse effect, there are two alternatives:

- Avoidance
- Mitigation: Alternative design, alternative location, limiting magnitude, rehabilitating historic properties, planning for preservation maintenance, moving the historic property, marketing properties for donation, documenting a property before destroying (HABS/HAER documentation), archeological data recovery

7 the control gates at Simmesport. Because over the last
8 probably 10, 12 years we lost about 10 feet of water at
9 Simmesport. And the first thing we need if we're gonna
10 improve water quality is water. It's pretty important, I
11 would think.

12

13 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Thank you. Are there any
14 other comments for hydrology? All right.

15

16 INVASIVE AQUATIC SPECIES

17 Brian(Invasive Aquatic): Everyone agrees that hydrilla is a
18 major problem. That needs to be addressed. I think that
19 everyone agreed on that.

20 Some of the possible solutions were the introduction of
21 grass carp to eat the hydrilla.

22 To conduct genetic research to find a better abatement
23 treatment.

24 Mechanical removal was recommended.

25 And finally, was that there's a small grouping of cane

1 that's in Butte La Rose now as another invasive. That was
2 all.

3

4 Courtney(Contractor): Does anyone have anything that they
5 would like to add to that?

6

7 Comment (name not verified): If you do like the person said
8 before, I don't recall his name. By doing what he said like
9 draining it, I think that it would help. So I would
10 suggest that the gentleman who said for us to keep that
11 water flowing if we put our efforts on that because
12 gentlemen, I'm telling you we have boat launches, we have
13 camp sites, we have nature walks, and everything. If we
14 don't control it, we're gonna lose it. I think our effort
15 should be put on hydrilla. The others can come in by
16 itself. Thank you.

17

18 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. Anyone else? We'll move on to
19 water quality.

20

21 WATER QUALITY

22 Katie(Water Quality): The first thing was the Mercury issue
23 in the Henderson area. So the biggest questions were:
24 How is Mercury going to be controlled in Henderson Lake.
25 How can you prevent Mercury levels from getting higher in

1 Henderson Lake

2 And is there any way to correct this problem.

3 And how is the Corps going to include this issue in
4 their project.

5 More fish need to be introduced in the Basin.

6

7 Courtney(Contractor): Does anybody have anything they would
8 like to add to those comments?

9

10 Harold Schoeffler: I think the study of the history of what
11 this area was before, the inside guide level, was built to
12 look at how this whole system functioned before oil field
13 canals and a lot of other interruptions came in and tried, as
14 much as possible, to look historically at the system. This
15 was an area of great quality fishing and it was fabulous. I
16 grew up as a young boy during the war in this area to fish.
17 And it was nothing to go to camping and get some worms and
18 catch 200 or 300 brim just off the levee. And we've saw that
19 decline. So I think if we're gonna talk about restoring it,
20 we need to look at what it was historically. Why was it so
21 productive, and what changes have come about to destroy
22 that. And can the those changes be manipulated and restored
23 so historical flows that could be put back in place. I
24 think we have a system that is capable of recovery. And I
25 think that we can grow very quickly.

1

2 Courtney (Contractor): Would anybody else like to add
3 anything for water quality?

4

5 Comment (name not verified): I think maybe the Corps needs
6 to get that accomplished because most of the water in the
7 Basin flows from south to north and we want it to go north
8 and south to the camps.

9

10 Harold Schoeffler: I was kind of stunned I guess three or
11 four years ago when it was right at the beginning of the
12 TOC. It must have been in September. And we would have
13 this massive fish kill. And it was probably the worst fish
14 kill I've ever witnessed. And we asked why and we really
15 didn't have any good answers. But there is a why and there
16 are answers, and we need to find out what are the causes,
17 what caused it, and make sure it doesn't happen again. And
18 I know that there were herbicides being used and that caused
19 the fish kill, that would be my guess. But I think science
20 has to come into play and find out what's the reason and
21 make sure it doesn't happen again.

22

23 Courtney (Contractor): Does anybody else have anything
24 they'd like to say?

25

1 Mayor of Henderson: I'll tell ya'll the reason I think the
2 fish died last year. We asked them too lower the level by
3 22 and a half feet because of the low pressure in the gulf
4 due to the hurricane. And If we would have lowered the
5 level somewhat last year, the majority of the water under
6 the hydrilla and let that leave. There was no oxygen there
7 before the low pressure would have came in. I think they
8 would have survived. We wouldn't have had as massive of a
9 fish kill as what we had.

10

11

12 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Anyone else for water quality
13 before we move on? Okay. We'll move on to habitat.

14

15 HABITAT

16 Dean(Habitat): Yes. I had a couple of things.

17 There are a lot of natural green canals in the entire

18 Basin that are cloaked with downed trees from hurricanes and

19 other storm events and as the result they're not navigable.

20 So people are having problems because they can't get to

21 their camps and they can't get to their favorite fishing

22 hole. That was the main comment I had.

23

24 Corps: Is there anyone here that needs for them to speak on

25 the NEPA process that may not understand it completely

1 because it is a process. And it's by law that the Corps of
2 Engineers has to go through this process and it's
3 called NEPA.

4

5 Comment (name not verified): Tell us what the process is.

6

7 Tonya(NEPA): We'll be happy to get into as much detail as
8 you want. It's kind of boring. It's the National
9 Environment Policy Act. It's the law that drives the process
10 we're in tonight. It sets up guidelines through the
11 counseling on environmental quality that gives us a process
12 to go through. It's where we take your input and that goes
13 into the environmental impact statement. And that is where,
14 through the process, we come up with alternatives. We start
15 the environment process, we find out where the data gaps are
16 where all this stuff plays out in the environment. And what
17 we're trying to do in the end is provide a decision-making
18 document for the Corps so they have all the information they
19 need to make an educated decision based on all variables all
20 these resources we're talking about tonight. Is there any
21 specific questions?

22

23 Comment (name not verified): When you do an EIS, how long is
24 the data good for?

25

1 Tonya (NEPA): The environmental quality guidelines are very
2 vague. I know that's not going surprise you, but it doesn't
3 specifically lay out a separation date. It's not like the
4 Corps of Engineers permit that expires in five years. You
5 have to go back and ask yourself is the data good enough.
6 are all the issues covered for us to make an educated
7 decision on this.

8

9 Comment (name not verified): Would a 1982 EIS be sufficient
10 for a 2006 project?

11

12 Tonya (NEPA): No, that's why we're here. We're updating it.
13 We're taking the existing data we have and going to update
14 that and add the new issues into it. And hopefully provide
15 a decision based on 2006 data.

16

17 Courtney (Contractor): Does anyone want to add anything to
18 this discussion?

19

20 Comment (name not verified) Does NEPA have anything to do
21 with the funding of the project?

22

23 Tonya (NEPA): NEPA becomes involved based on the funding.
24 In some situations, if we have federal funding involved then
25 NEPA comes into play and that's not written in stone, but

1 that's generally when NEPA becomes involved. When we have
2 federal funding.

3

4 Comment (name not verified): Is there funding for this
5 project?

6

7 Corps: It will be done with federal funding, yes.

8

9 Comment (name not verified): That's not what I asked. Do
10 you have the money now available to do the project or do you
11 have to request the money?

12

13 Corps: We have the money right now to do the project. We
14 get our money the Core of Engineers gets their funding on an
15 annual basis like every other federal agency gets their
16 money, so you know we've gotten money in the past every
17 year. So I know what the total funding is for the project,
18 and I think it's a safe assumption to believe that we'll get
19 it when we arrive at a project for this Henderson Management
20 Unit. We'll have the funds to do it.

21

22 Comment (name not verified): But it's not etched in stone
23 that we have the money to do this project.

24

25 Corps: There are no guarantees in life.

1

2 Jody Meche: I thought it was an interesting comment a while
3 ago. Nothing is etched in stone. And you know we expect to
4 get the money. Just I mean from what we got going on right
5 now here today I'm curious to see something, see some good
6 come out of all this effort. How much money you think we're
7 talking about and how about maybe a timeline. Just, you
8 know, as far as the projected future on when we're gonna see
9 something actually get done.

10

11 Corps: Well,-the timeline for getting a plan. A plan that
12 we don't know what it might be yet. It's probably going
13 take a year. Maybe a year and a half before we have a plan
14 that we can send up the chain of command, if you will, for
15 approval. At best I would say a year and a half. We're
16 actually looking right now by December of 2007. At which
17 time we should have another round of appointing discussion
18 so you can see the proposed plan and what we the Corps have
19 decided on. Which projects are going to be addressed in
20 that document. And they'll be many meetings between now and
21 then, public meetings

22

23 Comment (name not verified): Do ya'll have a limit on how
24 much money you can spend on the project?

25

1 Corps: \$250 million. That's the authorized amount to spend
2 for the Atchafalaya Basin. I can pretty much assure you it
3 will be several millions of dollars, but how many I have no
4 idea until you get a plan. You can't make an estimate on
5 the cost.

6

7 Courtney (Contractor): Is there anyone else that would like
8 to add something to that? Okay. I'd like to move on just to
9 make sure we can cover everything. I know a lot of people
10 are interested in recreation.

11

12 RECREATION

13 Joe(Recreation): We have a pinup board here.

14 And one suggestion was to clean up this the Butte La Rose
15 cut off right here. The north end's clogged up to clean it
16 up it's pretty full of debris right now.

17 And another comment about the Army Corps and Atchafalaya
18 Basin program need to always address the accessibility
19 issues in the Basin.

20 I had comment about expanding the ATV trails in this
21 area right here. Make it more of a recreational activity
22 that might be seasonal expand the trails particularly in
23 this area right here in the wildlife management area.

24 Comments about the this launch right here at the end of
25 Dixie Pipeline. It's in very poor condition. We need

1 improve that launch area. Had a couple of comments about
2 that

3 And I also had a comment about it would be a very good
4 location to have a primitive campground. So I had good
5 comments about several good discussions about that area
6 right there.

7 A comment about improving the Henderson area for
8 canoeing and recreation. I already mentioned the primitive
9 campgrounds here at Dixie Pipeline.

10 Someone recommended that we put some signage up on the
11 interstate saying that we have this in the wildlife
12 management area right here. They were coming to this
13 meeting from the Baton Rouge area and they noticed that they
14 didn't have a sign there in the management area there.

15 I had a couple of comments about improving boat launches
16 in Bayou Benoit. And another area down here to improve boat
17 launches here. And I think that covers the comments that
18 were made to me.

19

20 Courtney(Contractor): Are there any other comments about
21 recreation? Okay. I think that's it then. All right. So if
22 there's no other further comments, we'll try to wrap up this
23 evening. Thank you for staying the entire time to
24 participate in the discussion. This is an incredible
25 important part of this process and we do appreciate it.

6

HYDROLOGY

7

8 Benjamin (Hydrology):

9

1. Before we need to worry about the hydrology in the

10

Henderson Management Unit, we need to come up with an

11

overall water management plan for the Basin. And then look

12

at the smaller units.

13

2. Relook at the natural channels to introduce water.

14

Determine old water courses to bring water in using old

15

aerials.

16

3. Pipelines and spoil banks need to be lowered to their

17

natural level, basically taken out.

18

4. Fill in pipes or low use pipes.

19

5. All new oil and gas operations need to use directional

20

drilling in order to avoid more canals and disturbances

21

of the wetlands.

22

6. Try to inventory the best wetland areas and treat them

23

differently than areas that have already been disturbed,

24

basically preserving them the best we can.

25

7. Relook at the distribution of the Atchafalaya and the

1 Mississippi River during flood stage. Let the water rise
2 and fall as the river does, naturally.

3 Control sediments when water's introduced. Restore water
4 flow through the natural bodies. After that one just put
5 times four because I got a bunch of comments on that
6 subject.

7 Water needs to come from the Atchafalaya River, not from
8 the Courtableau structure.

9 Sediments need to be managed for the entire Basin, not
10 just for Henderson.

11 Also, we need to come up with a management plan for the
12 easements.

13 What is going happen to St. Landry Parish on the outside
14 of the Courtableau structure in other words, to flooding?
15 The Henderson Management Unit is controlled, the water
16 levels are controlled. Will it still be used as a flood
17 control?

18 Restore the natural hydrology, basically a flood and
19 dry cycle. Using the dry cycles to control hydrilla.
20 Stop using chemicals for hydrilla. It's pointless.

21 Need to use gauges through the Henderson Water
22 Management Unit in order to understand the current hydrology
23 historic hydrology gauges. They will be able to tell water
24 temperature, water level, chemical run-off, agriculture,
25 mainland etc.

1
2 Courtney (Contractor): Does anyone have anything they'd like
3 to add to that? All right. You did a good job Benjamin,
4 thank you. All right. We will move on into NEPA.

5

6 NEPA

7

8 Tonya (NEPA):

9 Is there any way the Corps can provide a list or an
10 outline of projects that are going on or are planned in the
11 Basin.

12

13 Corps: We can give a list of ongoing.

14 Tonya: We need to protect the Cypress Tupelo swamps because
15 once these trees are cut they won't grow back with all the
16 bad water on them.

17 Need to reconsider the Corps' timber easements within the
18 Basin.

19 Is there a way to provide incentives to private
20 landowners within the Basin to manage their land?

21

22 Courtney (Contractor): Does anyone have anything they'd
23 like to add?

24

25 Jody Meche: One good one would be that we need to figure

1 out what's the normal high water all cross the Basin, as
2 well as in the Henderson Management Unit because we have a
3 big problem with that in the Basin. A problem with public
4 access in the Basin. And I think that's something that
5 needs to be mapped, needs to be determined, and it needs to
6 be mapped so that everybody knows where we stand.

7

8 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Does anybody else have
9 anything they would like to talk about?

10

11 Corps: I would like to make a comment to the person who
12 made the first comment that you wrote down about what
13 projects are in the Basin. If whoever made that comment
14 will see me after this meeting, I'll address that for you.

15

16 Courtney(Contractor): In the back there, sir.

17

18 Harold Schoeffler: We desperately need a baseline. If we're
19 gonna try to grow something, we need to know where we are
20 now in terms of fisheries, resources, water quality, the
21 gauges that would monitor oxygen levels and water
22 temperature. It is very critical. We need to have sampling
23 through the system. We need to know how the crabs and
24 other animals are living. They don't live in oxygen. A
25 baseline needs to be developed and inventory of the birds,

1 the water fowl, the mammals there are there. Issues like
2 habitat for the black bear, the eagle, eagle nests, all of
3 those need to be looked at if we're gonna know five years
4 after we implement something that would be the baseline to
5 tell us whether we have been victorious in restoring the
6 Henderson Management Unit.

7

8 Tonya (NEPA): Can I say something for that? As part of the
9 EIS process, one of the chapters in the EIS will be the
10 affected environment. Or we will do our best to collect all
11 of that background data that you're talking about and
12 address the impact from the projects on those resources.
13 Everything from wildlife to fisheries to TNE to air quality
14 to water quality all that will be included in the draft
15 document. Yes, sir.

16

17 Comment (name not verified): You also look at all of the
18 old well sites cuttings and drillings that were dumped, the
19 produced waters with all the salt and all the impurities
20 that are removed in produced waters including radium 225 and
21 228. All of these issues need to be in this base line and
22 we've left platforms, creosote pilings. They haven't been
23 abandoned they're traps for outboard motors. Somebody in the
24 state knows about every well that's went down. Make sure
25 they have a record where it was abandoned.

1

2 Tonya (NEPA): Yes, sir. There sure is. By law they have
3 to keep track of that. It will be. There is a hazardous
4 waste and material section in the EIS. Now I'm not going
5 to promise you that we'll be doing water sampling and to that
6 level, but it should identify specifically those wells kept.

7

8 Charley Fryling: I think we also need the word cumulative
9 effects in that for the EIS. With the Corps' operations on
10 permits and all the other things that are going on in there,
11 what are the cumulative effects?

12

13 Tonya (NEPA): Yes, sir. That's been brought up every
14 meeting that we've had this week. That is part of the EIS
15 process. It is a requirement from the Federal Government
16 that cumulative impacts have to be addressed in this EIS. It
17 will look at all past projects that have affected the Basin
18 that's not part of this, and how they interplay with the
19 projects that we are proposing here.

20

21 Charles Fryling: Thank you.

22

23 Tonya (NEPA): Your welcome.

24

25 Courtney (Contractor): Yes, sir.

1

2 Buck Vandersteen: I'd like to see an inventory of current
3 land uses in the area and how this proposal would affect the
4 current land uses.

5

6 Tonya (NEPA): Yes, sir. There is a section in the EIS on
7 land use, and we should be using GIS analysis and landowners
8 data from the parishes. We'll get from the courthouse to
9 determine landowners and those kinds of things and to
10 determine what's in agriculture production, what's timbered,
11 you know those kinds of issues will be addressed in the EIS
12 also.

13

14 Courtney (contractor): Okay. Thank you. These are great
15 comments. Are there anymore comments before we move on?

16 Okay. Let's move on then to habitat.

17

18

19

HABITAT

20 Dean Goodin (Habitat): I think I got some of the same
21 comments that Tonya had or that she already mentioned.
22 First one is we need sustainable forestry management in
23 order to maintain and preserve the existing Cypress swamp
24 forest areas within the Basin.
25 More needs to be done to conserve the existing Cypress

1 swamps and trees that are there.
2 No more cutting, harvesting for Cypress mulch.
3 The environmental easements that have been purchased and
4 are located within the Basin are not doing any good to
5 preserve cypress swamps. The funding that's been given to
6 help restore some of the Cypress areas is not being utilize.
7 It's not making its way to the projects in order to provide
8 correct funding.
9 We need to purchase the land properties that are old
10 growth Cypress and not clear-cut areas and then try to
11 regrow, replant Cypress.
12 Essentially, we need permanent easements, not temporary
13 ones.
14 The Corps needs to come up with a plan in order to
15 control sediment in the Basin and return the sediment to the
16 Atchafalaya River in order to move it down south.
17 Sediment could possibly be used to restore coastal
18 wetland areas.
19 No more spoil banks.
20 We need to establish a corridor for black bear habitat
21 and designate critical wildlife habitat and come up with a
22 management plan to return the Ivory-billed Woodpecker to the
23 Basin. That's all I have.
24
25 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Yes, sir.

1

2 Buck Vanderstein: I'd like to see data from the Federal
3 Government on the inventory and health of the forest
4 resources in this affected area.

5

6 Courtney (Contractor): Okay.

7

8 Comment (name not verified) I would like to ask that any
9 permits in this system if they can help the goals of the
10 water management plan and not conflict with it. I know it's
11 a hard thing for the Corps to have the left hand know what
12 the right hand is doing, but it may be necessary in this
13 case. I might mention, too, that in sensitive areas
14 prohibitions have been made in terms of dumping produced
15 waters, drilling fluids, even to the point, for instance, in
16 Florida in the Mobile River, there's no pipelines allowed on
17 the surface anymore. They will have to be deep and
18 horizontally drilled. And Henderson is certainly an area
19 worthy of that protection. And I definitely think that
20 pipelines should be horizontally drilled in the Henderson
21 Management Unit.

22

23 Courtney (contractor): Any further comments on this topic
24 before I move on? Okay. We'll move on to water quality.

25

1

2

WATER QUALITY

3 Katie (Water Quality):

4 So like best management practices, what other practices
5 can be implemented to enhance water quality in the Basin?

6 Invasive should be controlled through water management
7 practices and not with herbicides.

8 And old, unused oil and gas pipes need to be taken out.

9 This could be linked to Mercury issues.

10 Is industry going to be inventoried in reference to
11 water quality issues when conducting an environmental impact
12 statement?

13 Something needs to be done about oil Mercury switches.

14 Natural flow in the Basin should be restored with an
15 emphasis on controlling sediments.

16 There needs to be more outlets in the Basin to equalize
17 fresh water distributions - especially in the southern part.

18

19 Courtney(contractor): That's it? Okay. Anyone else?

20

21 Jody Meche: I think we need to make a good positive
22 state-wide effort on informing our neighbors to the north,
23 the northern part of the country, that we're trying to fix
24 our water quality. We want to get some help from them to
25 help us fix our water quality down here. And we need to

1 send that message to Washington that it's not just our
2 problem, but it's the whole midsection of the country's
3 problem.

4

5 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Thank you. Yes, sir.

6

7 Harold Schoeffler: Historically, this area's blue crab and
8 white shrimp and brown shrimp and eels and a whole lot of
9 critters historically inhabited this area. And we should
10 make sure that this function is restored and maintained
11 while no dams to be placed. The tides rise and fall of the
12 system is important for all kinds of wildlife and fisheries
13 resources. When the swamp dries out, all kinds of plants
14 grow that feeds the ducks, feeds the crawfish, and
15 everything in the system. When you close it and your shrimp
16 and all can't come into the system, eel can't come to the
17 system you really knocked out a major portion of its
18 productive.

19

20 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Thank you. Does anyone else
21 have any comments on water quality?. Okay. We'll move on
22 to invasive species then.

23

24

25

INVASIVE SPECIES

1 Brian (Invasive Species):

2 Everyone agreed that hydrilla was a major problem within
3 the Henderson Management Unit. They recommended mechanical
4 or alternative treatments. One of those alternatives being
5 hydrology control.

6 Also it was noted that giant salvinia has been spotted in
7 the Basin. And that specific insects species could be
8 introduced to treat certain invasive vegetation.

9

10 Courtney (Contractor): That's it? Okay. Does anyone else
11 have anything they'd like to add to that?

12

13 Comment (Name not verified): To me the worst problem is
14 water hyacinths. It's almost impossible to navigate through
15 and nothing fits and it kills. All of the quality
16 vegetation underneath it takes over the habitat for duckweed
17 or something. And it's becoming a huge problem.

18

19 Courtney (Contractor): Thanks. Does anyone have anything
20 they'd like to add? No. Okay. Let's move on to cultural
21 resources then.

22

23

24

CULTURAL RESOURCES

25 Mike Godzinsky (Cultural Resources): I got a couple of good

1 comments. Productive comments.

2 One was that we should get signs put up, marker signs,
3 for the areas such as the Atchafalaya and Butte La Rose,
4 designating specific events that happened there.

5 Another comment was that the Corps do more research
6 clarifying where burials were.

7

8 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Anything else?

9

10 Comment (name not verified): I think it would be great to
11 deal with people, like some of the really historical
12 characters and figures of the Henderson area and people
13 really are the history of the region and to document that
14 history. That it was a part of the culture and life there.

15

16 Jody Meche: To add to what he's saying, that's a kind of
17 thing I'm willing to do one day. We can get the funding to
18 do it. I would like to have some type of historical museum
19 set up and have the history of all these families and the
20 culture of how they grew up, you know, the moss-picking days
21 and how they fished and how they guilt nets and all of that
22 formed into some type museum, which would attract locals as
23 well as tourists. And it's something that would interest
24 them about how the people actually survived in the Henderson
25 area, the Atchafalaya area, upper Grand area, and all of

1 these areas. And I think it's fascinating for people to
2 come and learn how people survived out there. And it's
3 something that we definitely need to support if we're really
4 gonna establish this area and make it what it's worth. It's
5 something that needs to be done and I hope that we can do it
6 and celebrate all of the different local families and record
7 some of the history, old photographs, and all of that. That
8 type of thing. Because you have history of the old type of
9 duck calls, old seeder duck calls. I mean there's so much
10 history behind that. Everybody that I meet wants one. They
11 got to have one built. And I give it to them for the cheap
12 price of \$25. And they think it's worth \$500 once they get
13 their hands on it. There's just so much that people in the
14 local area just don't know about, and they're just dying.
15 And I hate to see it just die. I want to see it
16 memorialized while some of these people are still alive and
17 can still tell the stories. We need to look into that and
18 make that happen.

19

20 Courtney(Contractor): Thank you. Does anyone else have any
21 other comments for cultural history? Yes.

22

23 Comment (Name not verified): We are separated from this
24 part of the Atchafalaya Basin because of the events in the
25 history of the basin floodway development. But I really

1 think, and it was touched on when we talked about hydrology,
2 that you want to look at the entire region to get a better
3 idea of how to approach your problems. I think that if we
4 approached also the cultural aspects regionally, that it
5 would be constructive to us to see especially how people
6 adapted to the environments and how they lived in those
7 environments. Even how the logging industry was
8 accomplished in the environments. That would be something
9 that would be constructive and worthy of sites or walking
10 tours and things like that in the Basin. So I just think
11 this is a really important thing and I'd like to say I'm
12 glad to be here.

13

14 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Any other comments for
15 culture resources? Ma'am?

16

17 Comment (name not verified): It jogged my mind that there
18 should be a lot of information in the Atchafalaya Basin
19 heritage. The heritage area has done a lot of work on the
20 cultural resources in and around the Basin, so that would be
21 a resource to look at.

22

23 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Thank you. All right. Any
24 more comments for cultural resources? We'll move on to
25 recreation then.

1

2

RECREATION

3 Joe Cancienne and Hope Pollman (Recreation): I received a
4 couple of comments.

5 First comment that I received was the identification of a
6 primitive fishing area located due east of Franklin and maybe
7 Sandy Cove.

8 Someone, when I was not at my station when I should have
9 been, wrote me a very polite note. The note simply says no
10 ATV trails in the Basin, please. There are some ATV trails
11 I know about in this area, if that person was referring to
12 that area, it would be helpful if he would report that to
13 Brittany, the court reporter, and that would be helpful.
14 And that's the only two comments I had.

15

16 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. We'll get started with Hope.

17

18 Hope (Recreation): Joe, could you define primitive fishing?
19 I thought that was very interesting too.

20

21 Joe (Recreation): I think that I got it. And it's just
22 fishing from the bank, along the bank.

23

24 Hope (Recreation): I had a few comments.

25 One of them was regarding the state park-type developed

1 campgrounds. And it's saying that there is a need for that
2 in the north and east sides of the Basin, particularly, just
3 south of I-10.

4 Also, I had a comment with concern about development
5 within the Basin. It should be kept natural and wet and
6 wild.

7 And also, the problems with too much development in the
8 Basin because it is a floodway and the damage you would do
9 it if you developed too much infrastructure.

10 And last comment that I got was that bird watching areas
11 are a really good idea, but that is tough to determine where
12 to put these because of the movement of the birds and
13 wildlife.

14

15 Courtney(Contractor): Thank you. Does anyone have any
16 recreation comments?

17

18 Comment(name not verified): Biking trails, hiking trails,
19 primitive campsites for backpacking, canoeing trails and
20 and things like that really needs good maps and, of course,
21 you need to make people aware that there's a big difference
22 between canoeing in high water and low water.

23

24 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. Thank you.

25

1 Comment (name not verified): There's something that needs
2 to get started and I see it happening. That is more and
3 more people using jet skis. You're trying to get it where
4 people can go and see eagles. And I mean you got people
5 going with jet skis all over making a lot of noises and
6 scaring the eagles away. Something like this I think we
7 need to address. It is very unique, you know, and you can
8 kill the uniqueness of those areas by promoting the wrong
9 things for those areas. And I mean they got a million lakes
10 at this place where you can go on the jet skis, you know.
11 There are migratory birds that go and feed in those lakes,
12 and if you develop the wrong thing, you're gonna kill what's
13 rare and unique in those areas.

14

15 Courtney(Contractor): Thank you.

16

17 Jody Meche: We've been talking about this issue a lot
18 lately because we're aware of the potential problem out
19 there. There's a lot of big alligators out there in the
20 Henderson area. And these people are swimming and skiing
21 and on jet skis and at anytime they may be vulnerable in the
22 water. Big alligators are kind of hungry, you never know
23 what might happen. I think we maybe ought to consider trying
24 to get some of these bigger alligators out of there,
25 because there's a lot of them. You don't see them in the

1 day time hours because they're kind of shy and timid. You
2 never know what they're gonna do. A boy was just recently
3 attacked in Florida. Especially when they're mating you see
4 them a lot. My brother saw a couple of them a while back.
5 One of them was one of the biggest alligators he's ever seen
6 in his life. We sure don't want to start losing our kids
7 out there. Because an alligator, when he's hungry, he's
8 gonna eat.

9

10 Courtney(Contractor): Do we have any more comments?

11

12 Comment (name not verified): I think we need to continue to
13 educate people around the country about the Atchafalaya.
14 One of my older lady friends, I saw her at a luncheon. She
15 said she had some relatives visiting her the week before
16 from up north. And they were leaving here to go to the
17 Everglades because they wanted to see a swamp. And I told
18 her that we have the Atchafalaya Basin right here. They
19 never heard of the Atchafalaya Basin, and they didn't know
20 anything about it. So they left Baton Rouge and flew to
21 Florida to see the Everglades because they have better name
22 recognition and people know about that. So I don't know
23 how we go about it, we just need to somehow let the rest of
24 the country know what we have. That's the best way to say
25 it. If people know, they'll start being concerned about

1 saving it.

2

3 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. Thank you. Anybody else?

4

5 Comment (name not verified). You know, we have a spot just
6 below the Butte La Rose rest area, a little kids fishing
7 peer that's not there yet, but it's very well the concept
8 has been meticulously developed and I think we just never
9 got enough money to really do it. But it's an excellent
10 site. It's walking distance from the exhibits at the Butte
11 La Rose rest area. I think it's going to be a great thing.
12 So I don't know if we can leverage the Corps of Engineers or
13 vast resources, to help us out and get that thing going, but
14 that would be a great attraction.

15

16 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Are there any other
17 recreation comments?

18

19 Comment (name not verified): One more comment on recreation,
20 and that's the image of the Basin. I think the general
21 public thinks of the Atchafalaya as a Cypress swamp. And
22 there is a unwritten verbal agreement between the Corps and
23 some of the environmental community that some point that we
24 would get at least 20,000 acres of Cypress landscape for
25 public access, which would directly be recreation. And I

1 think we should keep that as a general goal to go after the
2 very best Cypress landscape possible, because that is what
3 the public needs of the Atchafalaya.

4

5 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Anybody else on
6 recreation? Are there any other general comments before we
7 wrap up this evening? Would the Corps like to make any
8 closing comments?

9

10 Corps: I'd just like to reiterate how thankful we are for
11 all you people to come out tonight and share your night with
12 us. And I think we got some wonderful comments, so thanks
13 again. I think these comments tonight were just outstanding.
14 This is my first one to attend but if the comments have been
15 this good everywhere, I'm very very impressed, so thanks
16 everybody. Yes ma'am.

17

18 Comment(name not verified): I'm just impressed by how well
19 you've organized this and gave us all this opportunity.

20

21 Corps: Like we said earlier, we are doing everything we can
22 to get all these comments recorded, but I just want to
23 stress importance of submitting oral comments to Brittany
24 this evening or to submit written comments. And again we
25 have all these other options for submitting comments. They

1 will all be incorporated into our scoping document before
2 the 24th. After that, they will be considered to get into
3 that document. We do need them before August 24th. And if
4 you'd like extras please let me know before you leave and I
5 can get you those.

6

7 Jody Meche: I'd just like to say I think this is a
8 positive step in the right direction on how to do something
9 right.

10

11 Brian: Well, thank you everyone for coming.

JEANERETTE, LOUISIANA

2

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

3

JULY 27, 2006

4

5 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. So we're going get our
6 technical staff to just describe what they heard from you
7 all, major topics that were discussed. After they've
8 concluded their summary of what they heard, I'll ask if
9 anyone else might would like to add anything. If you do
10 have something to say if you could just stand up and say
11 your name and speak clearly and slowly, Brittany is
12 recording this word for word so do that to help her out.
13 That would be excellent. And on that same note, please
14 limit the comments, timewise, just to make sure that
15 everyone that would like to will get a chance to speak. So
16 we're gonna start right back in the corner here. Mike's
17 going give us a run down of what was talked about or
18 discussed for cultural resources.

19

20

CULTURAL RESOURCES

21

22

23

24

25

Mike(Cultural Resources): Two comments in cultural
resources. Cultural resources are always the lightest
topics in these things.
The first comment was that we need more open discussion
about the archeological sites. Where they are and how to

1 preserve them and what we could do to stop the infestation
2 that happens in the desperation of cemeteries and things
3 like that. The other comment was the comment that we also
4 received last night.

5 In these areas if we could mark these historical areas
6 for anything in the vicinity or anything that's visible on
7 surface. It's a good way to get people to stop at these
8 areas. So it will help the boat tours and it will help the
9 economy and history at the same time.

10 Courtney: Okay. Thank you Mike. Does anyone have anything
11 they'd like to add? No. Okay.

12 Raymond Allin: I spent all my time over here and I didn't
13 get over here. But I want you to have a historical site in
14 Jeanerette that's directly connected to the Atchafalaya
15 Basin. It's the home of one of the founders and owners of
16 the Jeanerette Lumber and Shingle Company. He still owns
17 the land in the Basin. But that company was located right
18 here where you're standing, in this part. And much of the
19 Cypress Tupelo from the Basin was transported from the Basin
20 down by Teche to this site to be built for housing and what
21 not. The home of this gentleman is right across the street.
22 I think that we should work on restoring that with the help
23 of Sanders Agency and private donations. It's a two and a
24 story Victorian home, and it's the home of Mr. Harry Hughes,
25 which was the founder of Lumber and Shingle Company.

1 Courtney (Contractor): Does anyone else have anything they'd
2 like to discuss with cultural resources? Okay. We'll move on
3 to Hydrology.

4

5

HYDROLOGY

6 Benjamin (Hydrology): One of the biggest comments I got was
7 not directly related to Henderson.

8 One of the main things that needs to be looked at is to
9 extend the Jeanerette Canal to Bayou Teche. After that
10 times 6 because I got that from six or seven different
11 people.

12 One of the other comments related to that was that there
13 is gauge data available. It could be looked at in order if
14 and when a project comes up. So there is very good gauge
15 data around the area. Back to Henderson.

16 One of the main points that I received was if the area
17 is flooded, how will that impact the landowners? They just
18 want to know about how it will impact the area if more of
19 the land in the northern parts flooded.

20

21 Courtney (Contractor): Does anyone want to add anything to
22 that? All right. Great summary thank you. We'll move on
23 to habitat.

24

25

1 HABITAT

2 Dean(Habitat):

3 There are two many groups involved that have their own
4 little agenda in the Basin. We all need to get those groups
5 together and make one large group.

6 I had a comment about in Charenton. There are a lot of
7 house boats tied up to Cypress trees that are used for
8 hunting camps or to pull them, and it's creating notches of
9 Cypress to tie up these boats, and when the storm comes
10 through, it turns the boats over. They're an eye sore. And
11 no one really has the permission to go out there and clean
12 them up. No enforcement action.

13 And the last comment was how will the Corps' water
14 management plan affect the Cystine timber industry in the
15 Basin. There are certain species in there that cannot
16 tolerate water for long periods of time. How will the water
17 management plan affect those types of species?

18 We should consider dredging fish holes at Lake Henderson
19 using the dredge material for islands to support bird
20 habitat. Also, when the lake gets lower, fish will have a
21 place to go:

22

23 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Does anyone have anything to
24 add to that? No. Okay. We'll move on to water quality.

25

1 WATER QUALITY

2 Katie (Water Quality): I have one comment.

3 We need to implement an ecosystem restoration plan for
4 Lake Fausse Point to improve the water default.

5

6 Courtney (Contractor): Does anybody else have anything
7 they'd like to add for water quality.

8

9 Simone Champagne: I'd like to just comment on the
10 restoration projects for the Fausse Point. The Corps has
11 done some studies on that at this time. And I feel that
12 that project falls into water quality. You could also put
13 it into habitat. It also fits into cultural resources. It
14 also fits into hydrology and recreation. And with the
15 purpose in the goal of this project, basically, would be to
16 dredge portions of the lake that is silting in quite rapid
17 rates. The habitat side will increase oxygen levels in the
18 water. Commercial fishermen, as well as our recreational
19 fisherman have lost a lot of that over the years because of
20 the water level being so low. It also helps the flood
21 system because a lot of people don't realize that New Iberia
22 drains into those two lakes. And what's happening is at the
23 mouth of those canals that the water flows out of the city
24 of New Iberia silting up so much the water can't flow in so
25 it's also causing a flooding problem in some areas of ours.

1 Of course, we want to protect all of our cultural resources.
2 That's what we're about here in Louisiana. That's what
3 people know us for and that restoration project, along with
4 the ecotourism parks that we want to build on Lake Fausse
5 Point will all enhance those.

6

7 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Anybody else have
8 anything they'd like to add to water quality? Okay. We'll
9 move on to invasive aquatic vegetation.

10

11 INVASIVE AQUATIC VEGETATION

12 Brian (Invasive Aquatic). Everyone I spoke to agreed that it
13 is a major problem for the entire Basin, including the
14 Henderson Water Management Unit. The issue of invasive
15 animal species was brought up and the impact on these areas.
16 And that's it.

17

18 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Thank you. Would anyone like
19 to add to that? No? Okay. We'll move on then.

20

21 RECREATION

22 Joe (Recreation): Few comments from the recreation.
23 One comment. We need in Myette boat landings and Eagle
24 Point Park.
25 Another comment. We are in favor of continuing and

1 pushing the Eagle Point project because it is vital to the
2 economy in this area. A place on the Jeanerette Canal
3 someone suggested that connection be made to the Teche.
4 There's another point or pin placed on the Jeanerette Canal
5 that someone recommended caution about doing that for
6 similar reasons as Simone mentioned about the other canal
7 that comes in from New Iberia and the siltation problem.
8 That was someone against the idea of connecting the
9 Jeanerette Canal.

10 And there was a comment to improve a boat launch on Bayou
11 Teche. The point was made as a sort of connection to the
12 Teche and the Jeanerette Shingle Company as a historical
13 relationship to the Atchafalaya Basin.

14

15 Hope(Recreation): My other comments were very similar for
16 recreation and included Eagle Point Park and the comments
17 tied into the importance to the socioeconomic development of
18 the communities in this area, and that's pretty much
19 everything that Joe just said, although, I did have a
20 comment about where wildlife viewing areas should be and
21 felt that that was a good idea and important thing to
22 incorporate in the Basin. That's all the comments I had.

23

24 Courtney(Contractor): Are there any other recreation
25 comments?

1 Raymond Allin: The mayor's left and I don't think he had the
2 chance to be properly recorded, so I'm gonna speak for him.
3 On behalf of the City of Jeanerette, I think the Mayor
4 would agree with the statement that I'm gonna make. The city
5 of Jeanerette believes that Eagle Point Park is probably one
6 of the most important projects to have been proposed or
7 introduced in this area over the last 50 years. This is not
8 a new idea. It was an idea which conceived many, many years
9 ago, and it was such a great idea that somebody took it and
10 they built Lake Fausse Point Park. It was originally
11 proposed for our area. It is extremely important, I think,
12 both for recreational purposes and also for economic
13 purposes for our community. This little community has been
14 through a very difficult time over the last 10 or 15 years.
15 We lost much of our industry and we're struggling. One of
16 the most wonderful things we have here are the natural
17 resources that surrounds us both to the north and south of
18 us. And this project would really put a focal point on
19 those opportunities and help us to attract people down to
20 this area to enjoy those resources with us. I personally
21 believe, and I know the Mayor does of the city, would take
22 the position that Eagle Point is one of the most important
23 project that we can consider in this whole scheme about what
24 to do in the Atchafalaya Basin.
25

1 Courtney (Contractor): Thank you. Are there any further
2 comments? No. Then we'll move on to NEPA.

3

4 NEPA

5 Tonya(NEPA): We had some good discussion, but I have no
6 comments in relation to NEPA. Thank you.

7

8 Courtney (Contractor): Does anybody have any questions about
9 the NEPA process or anything they would like to add for that
10 discussion? All right. Everybody knows NEPA. Does anyone
11 have any general comments or anything that has not been
12 discussed yet that they'd like to bring up?

13

14 Corps: I'd like to thank Simone Champlin for organizing
15 this. In fact, everything we've done down here we can thank
16 Simone. I just want to publically say thank you.

17

18 Simone: I have to say, though, it would not be done without
19 the hard work of numerous people that were very generous to
20 us. As well as the Corps over all these years and we have a
21 wonderful board that has been in place the same board for
22 six years. So it's a lot of work it's been a lot of fun
23 and it's coming along, so we are very grateful to a lot of
24 people. Thank you.

25

1 Courtney (Contractor): All right. Do you want to add
2 anything this morning, Lamar?

3

4 Lamar: No. I'd just like to take the opportunity to say
5 thank you again to everyone. I'm sorry that a lot of people
6 left. So thanks again for taking time out of your busy day.

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BAYOU SORREL, LOUISIANA

PUBLIC DISCUSSION

4

JULY 28, 2006

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6 Courtney(Contractor): We will begin our public discussion
7 now. Just remember when you give a comment to state your
8 name because Brittany, our court reporter will be taking all
9 this down word for word. So if she could get your name,
10 that would be very helpful for our records, and again speak
11 clearly and slowly. And try to limit your comments to just
12 a few minutes so that everyone that wants to give a comment
13 does have a chance to speak tonight. And I think that about
14 covers it. So we're gonna start with NEPA, with Tonya,
15 although I believe we didn't have any comments this evening.

16

17

NEPA

18

Tonya(NEPA): No comments.

19

20

21 Courtney(Contractor): There's one other thing. Once a
22 conversation gets started if you could try to remember
23 please don't talk over one another because we won't be able
24 to capture that in the notes Brittany is taking. So then
25 we'll move on to habitat.

25

1 HABITAT

2 Brian(Habitat):

3 I had some comments on the importance of the control
4 structure at Wax Lake Alley. That would provide more water
5 to the Basin, which would help the crawfish and other
6 sports.

7 I had another one. It goes under recreation though. It
8 was that the Corps needs to keep in mind not everyone would
9 want more recreational facilities in the area and would
10 rather preserve the way things used to be in the Basin.
11 A biologist said that the basin is one of the most productive
12 areas in the world as far as habitat and it's worth
13 preserving.

14

15 Courtney(Contractor): That's it? Does anyone else have
16 anything they'd like to add on the discussion? Okay. We'll
17 move on to invasive aquatic vegetation.

18

19 INVASIVE AQUATIC VEGETATION

20

21 Brian (Invasive Aquatic):

22 Invasive aquatic vegetation is a problem throughout the
23 entire Basin. If something's not done, it's going to become
24 a bigger problem.

25

1 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. Well, before we move on does
2 anyone else have anything they'd like to add to that? Okay.
3 We'll move on to water quality.

4

5

6 WATER QUALITY

7

8 Katie (Water Quality): No comments.

9

10 Courtney (Contractor): Okay. Then we'll move on to
11 hydrology.

12

13 HYDROLOGY

14 Benjamin (Hydrology):

15 Management of the sediments into the basin.

16 Silting problems.

17 No more spoil banks.

18 Oil companies should have to directionally drill, or if

19 they do have to dig. They need to barge the dirt out.

20 More water flow through the system by using old/natural

21 bayous with water from the river, also controlling the

22 sediments with water flow.

23 I had a habitat comment. This kind of falls under habitat.

24 No temporary easements, only permanent easements.

25 Buying Cypress Tupelo swamp for mitigation.

1

2 Courtney(Contractor): I think that about covers it. All
3 right does anyone have anything else they'd like to add?

4

5 Mr. Ashley: Yeah. I have a comment on the talking about the
6 easements and everything on the land. I think the state
7 should make a concerted effort to try to clear the titles up
8 and everything. They need to go ahead and make it public
9 and let it be now what people own and don't own because they
10 have controversy in leasing land to these clubs. One land
11 owner may lease the same land and the state claim it and
12 another claim it and it got called a mixed up in different
13 clubs. Because if one club is leasing it from one landowner
14 and another club leasing the same land from another
15 landowner and everything and a lot of it is state land and
16 they call it quite a controversy.

17

18 Courtney(Contractor): Thank you. Okay.

19

20 Kristine Herbert: I'm not quite sure what hydrology is, but
21 does that have anything to do with bank stabilization? And
22 It may be out of line, but I just know in the City of
23 Plaquemine area, we worked with the Corps on bank
24 stabilization and erosion just listening to comments and
25 thinking about what the future holds and important sites

1 we'd like to prove. We could also do a long-term vision
2 plan whereby we could work with the Corps to provide bank
3 stabilization even for residential properties. I know
4 sometimes people that do have properties that's adjacent to
5 the area and they do need bank stabilization, but sometimes
6 it may be a very costly measure. So if there's some kind of
7 goal we could work towards to make feasible program, I think
8 that would be something to entertain.

9

10 Courtney(Contractor): Yes, sir.

11

12 Comment: I think the Corps they can like when they cut
13 this cut-off on Grand River here, within the bayou, what
14 they cut made a cut off from cut around, they said after
15 they cut that well they gave up regulating, looking after
16 that, and maintaining it. A part of the bayou where the
17 cut-off and it seemed like they're responsible now that it
18 has filled up. And I would hope the Corps would consider
19 maintaining that portion of the bayou what they said they
20 don't maintain anymore, because it's their fault the reason
21 it filled up. I think that's what caused that water to
22 surge up in there every time a boat passed and every time the
23 water surged up in the Old Bayou, well it draws a sediment
24 and so it has filled up so you can't navigate it hardly.

25

1 Courtney(Contractor): Yes ma'am?

2

3 Comment (name not verified): We'd like to reiterate what
4 Mr. Ashley has said. We have invested for the City of
5 Plaquemine since 1993 close to \$6 million in our downtown
6 historic district. We have the Bayou of Plaquemine, which
7 was at one time adjoined to the Mississippi River, which is
8 no longer, but goes in the Basin. We have put a park site
9 and we've also worked with the Corps of Engineers for fresh
10 water pumps to bring water into the Bayou Plaquemine to
11 improve the fishing habitat. We have a park that features
12 recreational opportunities at the park site. We have found
13 that many boaters have told us the same thing that was just
14 reiterated a moment ago. When there was some dredging done,
15 the way it was done and the debris that was left, the boats
16 can't get through. So they can't have access back to the
17 park site which is in downtown Plaquemine. And that is a
18 severe crotch to what it was that we worked so hard to get
19 all this time when it's been like 13 years and finally we
20 have two phases of the park now done and we're now working
21 on phase three of the park site. So those things do affect
22 City of Plaquemine, even though they are seven to ten miles
23 away from our site.

24

25 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. Thank you.

1
2 Comment (name not verified): You might add that it was an
3 original bayou, Grand River.

4
5 Comment(name not verified): I want to mention that the
6 system isn't natural anymore. There are concentrated
7 sediments in the main channel. You know the Atchafalaya
8 Basin, that's the only place where the sediment can spread
9 out and they will silt up any swamps we use. So if you want
10 the Basin to be here for your kids and grandkids, you have
11 to manage this area. And I think being the most important
12 one that is left in the continent, I think it's worth an
13 effort.

14
15 Courtney(Contractor): thank you. Okay, No other comments
16 on this topic? Okay. We'll move on. Are there any
17 comments for Cultural Resources or Socioeconomics? No
18 comments? Let's go on to Recreation then.

19

20 RECREATION

21 Joe (Recreation): I have a couple of comments.
22 The area, Bayou Sorrel, in the middle along the
23 Atchafalaya River area, we do not want to see any recreation
24 areas developed in that region.
25 Between Bayou Pigeon and Bayou Sorrel, along that

1 portion of the Basin there.

2 I received a comment about the boat ramp at Pigeon. We

3 want to make sure that that boat ramp is more accessible to

4 handicap and older people. In contrast to the old launch in

5 Belle River, which is not as accessible.

6 There's an Indian mound buried near where we are now.

7 And there is comment about preserving that Indian mound.

8 Additionally, to use the Indian mound as a point of interest

9 to enhance and develop other features. And all of the pins

10 that we have are used in that area are near that mound. So

11 there's a variety of features that are requested there. And

12 the point of having these in addition to those features.

13 There was a suggestion that we should have an

14 interpretive center here. One that relates to the Indian

15 culture of the area.

16

17 Hope (Cultural Resources): And I had very similar comments.

18 Just to add to that.

19 The ecotourism should be one of the main emphases,

20 emphasizing low impact forms of recreation to protect the

21 environment. Also, that we still have time to discourage

22 some of the more destructive forms of recreation in the

23 Basin. And that's number of comments about the interpretive

24 site. So that's it.

25

1 Courtney(Contractor): Okay. That's it? Okay, thank you.
2 Anyone else have any other comments?
3
4 Comment (name not verified): I have a comment on about the
5 locke, but I don't know if it's the right time to do it. On
6 the new locke they got built down here. This would be
7 concerning recreation in some way because why they put the
8 locke down here below Bayou Sorrel comes out from the
9 Atchafalaya. Well it's gonna carry a tremendous amount of
10 sand in high water and every time you open that locke, you're
11 gonna get a tremendous volume of sand into the draining
12 river. And so any other recreation bayous we could use on
13 the inside of the levee is gonna fill them up over a period
14 of time because the locke is gonna be a lot bigger than the
15 old locke we have. Because you put that locke above where
16 Bayou Sorrel comes out, well you wouldn't get near the sand
17 coming down Grand River. You could see water delivered
18 coming down Grand River and the spoil pit along the pit and
19 you wouldn't have near the high maintenance to get rid of.

 Other: Get water out of the main channel and let it flow into the backwater areas. Keep the water moving. Look at the possibility of lowering the elevation of the guide levees along the main channels. Open up historic watercourses to improve water flow. Close pipeline and access canals and restore the landscape to a natural condition. If sediment traps are considered establish a maintenance plan that will not adversely impact the environment. Consider the benefits of altering the 70% - 30% low water and 50% - 50% high water allocations at the control structure.

I have always felt that there should be an overall water management plan established before the design and implementation of the individual units. It is possible that the Henderson Unit may be one of the few units that can be implemented individually. If so, it is the exception and not the standard. Each of the thirteen water management units affects the hydrology of adjacent areas. Design and management efficiencies call for an overall solution before the implementation of its parts.

tupelo landscape. This is the type of landscape that most people think about when they think about the Atchafalaya swamp.

The Army Corps of Engineers gave an unwritten commitment to the environmental community that they would set aside 20,000 acres of cypress/tupelo landscape as public access lands. This commitment has not yet been accomplished. High value natural areas should be managed in a way that will retain the natural benefits of these areas. Both the permitting process and the development/management process should have more stringent requirements in these areas. The National Environmental Policy Act requires that aesthetics should be considered in all major federal actions.

Highway and pipeline right-of-ways should not use chemicals for vegetation control. Future oil and gas operations should be required to use directional drilling from approved locations. Any new pipelines should be designed so that they do not alter natural hydraulic flows.

Information derived from the Governor's Coastal Forestry Science Initiative indicates that many of the trees in the Floodway are unable to regenerate naturally. This fact should cause the Army Corps of Engineers to rethink their Atchafalaya Environmental and Forestry Easements. The easements as currently written do not protect the existing trees. The initial plan for the Atchafalaya envisioned that selective cutting of trees would be allowed not the massive cutting of trees that is being allowed under the current easement. Protection of existing trees should have the highest priority.

Future tourism and recreation should be a major components of the Louisiana economy. "Louisiana the Bayou State", "Sportsmen's Paradise" and our special culture are all dependent on keeping the Atchafalaya and similar landscapes in a natural condition. Most developments should be kept out of the Atchafalaya Floodway. The Corps has the overriding obligation of providing flood protection for South Louisiana and keeping the Basin "Wet and Wild" is about the only way to insure the Atchafalaya can be used as a floodway if needed. The Corps of Engineers should be credited with some of the benefits of development outside of the floodway but little, with the exception of "access" and "interpretive recreation" should be a part of their direct involvement.

Henderson WMU SEIS

1) In order to update the original EIS, it will be necessary to look at the cumulative impacts of all changes in the Basin. This should include changes in hydrology caused by the effects of dredging for navigation, "channel training" projects, intentional openings and closure of channels, private pipeline and canal work, and unintentional effects of these activities. In some cases, projects have been installed and partially removed. In these cases, the remaining portion of the modifications may be negatively affecting the hydrology and water quality in the remaining natural swamp habitat. In areas found to be under such conditions, the potential improvements from fully removing obsolete modifications should be evaluated as future project options.

2) Because of the connections between dredging operations, water level management, and socioeconomic aspects in the Henderson area, consideration should be given to working with local operators to improve access during low water seasons. One possibility might be coordination with boat launch operators to allow them access to Corps contract resources for a nominal fee in order to connect their facilities to newly dredged access canals. Improved access for tour boat, houseboats and launch facilities would reduce opposition to proper water level management of the lake area and subsequent invasive plant control and cypress regeneration.

3) All new water introduction projects should consider the desirability of "over-bank" flow along long stretches of land, instead of single-point penetrations. The more natural process of bank overflow tends to deposit sediment behind natural or artificial levees rather than in channels, and reduces the acceleration of land conversion from swamp to bottomland hardwood that naturally occurs in the Basin. Prevention of land conversion is not necessarily a desirable goal but neither is the increased rate of conversion which has been observed in the Basin since the creation of the Floodway and since the initial EIS was approved.

ABFS Recreational SEIS

1) Any plans for an interpretive center near Morgan City should include support for development of a coastal research facility that would focus on the swamp-marsh interface. A model for such a cooperative facility might be the BTNEP/LUMCON Marine Center in Cocodrie, LA.

2) Any plans for increasing the accessibility of the Basin to visitors should not be undertaken without comprehensive support for education and current information transfer concerning the conditions and dangers of traveling in the Basin and the private property considerations that have been codified by the legislature. These laws place the responsibility for determining ownership and access rights on the part of the visitor.

HENDERSON WATER MANAGEMENT UNIT.

Hydrology

All natural bayous should be restored with fresh water from the Atchafalaya River.

Efficient sediment traps should be created and maintained.

To assure proper water distribution throughout the system, enough water outlets should be created all across the lower end of the unit.

Please, see enclosed map.

Environment/habitat

When purchasing new land, buying wetland forests that have not been logged in the past few decades should be a priority. Negotiations with land owners willing to sell their land should include assurances that swamps will not be logged before the transaction takes place.

Protecting cypress-tupelo swamps should be a priority. Those forests are not renewable for the most part and the Corps should be very clear to land owners that at this point no swamps that have already been logged will be purchased.

Never allow any timber harvesting on swamps owned by the public.

Bottomland hardwood forests should be managed to remain mature hardwood forest. No timber harvest. Mature hardwood forest ecosystems are very rare but are very important for many species of animals.

The environmental easements are useless. CHANGE THEM TO INCLUDE NO CUTTING OF TIMBER

Environmental quality

Oil companies should be required to remove all the old mercury manometers and to clean-up all the mercury that they deposited in the Atchafalaya Basin.

No more permits should be approved for new canals with spoil banks in the Atchafalaya Basin.

Oil companies should clean-up their mess. Old pipes should be removed, old tanks and platforms should be dismantled and properly disposed of outside the Atchafalaya Basin.

No more use of pesticides and herbicides inside the Atchafalaya Basin.

The environmental easements are useless. Change them to include no cutting of timber.

Economic

No development should be allowed inside the Atchafalaya Basin. Only minor development to promote eco-tourism should be allowed.

Bird watching and eco-tourism should be the main goal for tourism development in the Atchafalaya Basin.

Always remember that the Atchafalaya Basin contains some of the most important forest ecosystems and wetlands on the continent.

ATCHAFALAYA BASIN FLOODWAY SYSTEM RECREATIONAL TOPICS

Saving the Atchafalaya Basin for future generations should be a priority. In order to accomplish that I recommend the following steps to be taken:

1. Reconsider the 70/30 split.
2. Reduce as much as possible the sediment load coming from the Mississippi River
3. Creation of a sediment trap system that is efficient and easy to maintain. Please look at attached map.
4. No more spoil banks in the Atchafalaya Basin.
5. No more projects that will increase the sediment loads into wetlands.
6. Common sense projects in which the water will flow north to south.
7. No more pinyon project should ever be authorized in which wetlands are forever lost for the temporary benefits of a few.

Tourism


Only forms of tourism that will have very little or no negative environmental impact on the Atchafalaya Basin's different ecosystems should be promoted, for example ecotourism. Ecotourism can include hiking, bird watching, camping, canoeing and any other activity that does not seriously disturb or damage those ecosystems.

In order to protect the tourism potential of the Atchafalaya Basin these two steps should be taken and they should be a priority for the Corps:

1. The current environmental easements should be reconsidered. They are useless to protect forested wetlands and should be changed to include no timber harvest.
2. Willing sellers of forested wetlands to the state should be warned not to log their swamps before the sale takes place. Saving existing cypress-tupelo swamps while the trees are still there should be a priority of the Corp of Engineers and the state of Louisiana.

___ Other: Get water out of the main channel and let it flow into the backwater areas. Keep the water moving. Look at the possibility of lowering the elevation of the guide levees along the main channels. Open up historic watercourses to improve water flow. Close pipeline and access canals and restore the landscape to a natural condition. If sediment traps are considered establish a maintenance plan that will not adversely impact the environment. Consider the benefits of altering the 70% - 30% low water and 50% - 50% high water allocations at the control structure.

I have always felt that there should be an overall water management plan established before the design and implementation of the individual units. It is possible that the Henderson Unit may be one of the few units that can be implemented individually. If so, it is the exception and not the standard. Each of the thirteen water management units affects the hydrology of adjacent areas. Design and management efficiencies call for an overall solution before the implementation of its parts.

5 Environment/habitat

- 5 Wildlife (fisheries, threatened and endangered species, etc.)

2 Invasive aquatic vegetation (Hydrilla, Hyacinth, etc.)

___ Other: Investigate the location of the "best" and largest "natural" areas in the entire Basin. The definition of best and natural should include both aesthetics and environmental productivity. Special attention should be given to finding good examples of cypress

tupelo landscape. This is the type of landscape that most people think about when they think about the Atchafalaya swamp.

The Army Corps of Engineers gave an unwritten commitment to the environmental community that they would set aside 20,000 acres of cypress/tupelo landscape as public access lands. This commitment has not yet been accomplished. High value natural areas should be managed in a way that will retain the natural benefits of these areas. Both the permitting process and the development/management process should have more stringent requirements in these areas. The National Environmental Policy Act requires that aesthetics should be considered in all major federal actions.

3 Environmental quality

4 Water quality (mercury advisories, low dissolved oxygen water, pesticides/agricultural runoff, etc.)

4 Oil and gas operations

— Other: Close and restore the landscape at abandon or underutilized oil and gas facilities. Remove or isolate inappropriate materials from the Basin. Do not use herbicides nor other chemicals for vegetation control. Consider hydrology for invasive aquatic vegetation control. Highway and pipeline right-of-ways should not use chemicals for vegetation control. Future oil and gas operations should be required to use directional drilling from approved locations. Any new pipelines should be designed so that they do not alter natural hydraulic flows.

Information derived from the Governor's Coastal Forestry Science Initiative indicates that many of the trees in the Floodway are unable to regenerate naturally. This fact should cause the Army Corps of Engineers to rethink their Atchafalaya Environmental and Forestry Easements. The easements as currently written do not protect the existing trees. The initial plan for the Atchafalaya envisioned that selective cutting of trees would be allowed not the massive cutting of trees that is being allowed under the current easement. Protection of existing trees should have the highest priority.

3 Economic (Tourism/recreation, agriculture, development, commercial, residential)

Future tourism and recreation should be major components of the Louisiana economy. "Louisiana the Bayou State", "Sportsmen's Paradise" and our special culture are all dependent on keeping the Atchafalaya and similar landscapes in a natural condition. Most developments should be kept out of the Atchafalaya Floodway. The Corps has the overriding obligation of providing flood protection for South Louisiana and keeping the Basin "Wet and Wild" is about the only way to insure the Atchafalaya can be used as a floodway if needed. The Corps of Engineers should be credited with some of the benefits of development outside of the floodway but little, with the exception of "access" and "interpretive recreation," should be a part of their direct involvement.

Recreation facilities should be located at or just outside of the floodway levees. All facilities should be designed to withstand flood conditions. Dear Corps:

Please accept these comments on behalf of myself, Leigh Haynie, my family, as a member of the Acadian Group of the Sierra Club and a supporter of the Louisiana Crawfish Producers Association – West. I am a recreational fisherman and birdwatcher and person with a canoe.

You must use the best available science. You must comply with all of NEPA.

I am concerned for all endangered and threatened species that use the area. You must comply with the ESA.

As a mother, I am concerned about water quality. You must comply with the CWA and not degrade the waters of this State any more than they already are.

You must have an adequate direct, indirect, and cumulative impact analysis, including, but not limited to, how your actions will affect those areas down below Henderson.

You must have an alternative of restoration, that is opening up natural and historic bayous.

You must acknowledge that the area is on the 303(d) list for Mercury and all dredging is going to redistribute mercury. I and my family are concerned about the low dissolved oxygen counts, total suspended solids, turbidity, and increased sedimentation in all of the area, specifically in the West Atchafalaya Borrow Pit Canal-From Bayou Courtableau to Henderson, La., including Bayou Portage. There is supposed to be a TMDL in place. Do you have a NPDES permit for any subject activities you may do?

I oppose all logging in the Henderson Management Unit. I oppose all commercial extraction in the area (except for commercial fishing). I oppose the spraying of all herbicides. The EIS must contain an adequate description of the poisons sprayed in the area, compliance with FIFRA, and a detailed breakdown of the chemicals involved.

There should be a detailed survey for all species, including birds, fish, reptiles, and amphibians.

I oppose all dredging projects and the filling of any wetlands. How will dredging and the creation of more spoil banks affect wading birds, such as herons, egrets (such as snowy egrets), and bitterns?

I support the filling of all location canals.

The EIS should contain site-specific data.

The EIS should contain a map showing land ownership.

Monitoring and mitigation measures should identify who (as in a name or an office) will be responsible for maintaining these records, where the monitoring and mitigation will be archived, and how this information will be distributed to the public.

I am concerned about the effects of this project on the following species: Red Wolf; Florida Panther; Wood Stork; Osprey; and Gulf Sturgeon.

I am concerned about the effect of this project on spawning fish. The Basin is a fertile area for spawning species, such as sac-au-lait; white shrimp; gulf sturgeon; sheephead; and blue crab. What about eels that must leave this area to go to spawning grounds? Will the project impede the migration? The Basin is affected by the tide. Will this project impede tidal influence? We are concerned about the effects on paddle fish?

1. Where are abandoned oil wells, oil fields, and pipelines located in the project area?
2. How many abandoned oil and gas wells have NOT been plugged?
3. Are any of the pipelines leaking in the project area?
4. Will the dredging necessary for this project "stir up" and increase mercury levels or any other heavy metals to be found in the sediment to be dredged?
5. Why aren't the natural bayous going to be opened?
6. How will this project affect flood control?
7. What effect will this project have on crawfish yields? Do you have base-line population numbers for crawfish? Documented evidence of the yields in the past year, five years, ten years?
8. What effect will this project have on the yield on frog harvests?
9. Will additional spoil banks be created by the Corps' actions?
10. How will public access be protected and enhanced by this project? Will the public be required to pay for the use of boat ramps?
11. How will this project affect the availability of canoe trails and high ground camp sites?
12. How will this project affect the economics of the area? Specifically, how will this project affect fur trappers who trap mink, coon, nutria, and otter? Also, will this project have any affect on apiaries in the area or the oyster beds?
13. As state taxpayers we are concerned about the protection of section 16 lands. Are there any section 16 lands in the area? Have the school boards been notified?
14. Is there any baseline information on the benthos in the area?
15. Social and historical sites exist in the area: cemeteries; Indian mounds; and pioneer remnants. Has the State Historical Preservation Officer been consulted?
16. There is a lot of junk in the area: old bridges; pilings; flowlines; cement mats; and abandoned equipment. We are also concerned about the location canals and abandoned load sites. What steps will the Corps take to clean this up?
17. Have there been any core samples taken in this area? We are concerned about the wastes in the area: drilling muds; produced waters; and well cutting.
18. What are the Total Maximum Daily Loads in the area? Will this project significantly affect the TMDLs?
19. Have there been any chemical spills or petroleum spills in the area?
20. Will this project affect air quality? Visual quality?

21. Will this project negatively affect tourism?
22. Why is a private corporation logging on state lands? What are the forestry management plans?
23. Is there any baseline information on the insects, spiders, honey bees, and wasps?

The EIS needs to contain the following: site-specific information on wildlife, plant species, soils, water, and specific mitigation measures; cumulative impact analysis; and an explanation for the amount of access being closed. The EIS also must include a reasonable range of alternatives.

20 COMMENT: Like I told Brian this morning, our main concern
21 is our business. And if they drain the water before they
22 dredge the landings we gonna lose all our business. A few
23 years ago when they openly did that, we lost about 200 buses
24 coming in. That's, you know, revenue coming into the state.
25 The hydrilla's got to go, but we also need some help so that

1 we can continue operating. Because when they did that the
2 last time, we had to make a walk across about, I want to
3 say, a 150 feet across the island to put out boats out so we
4 could continue operating. And then we got a fish kill and
5 lost buses because who wants to come smell dead fish? So
6 that's our main concern. We definitely need to get rid of
7 the hydrilla. We also need to stay operating for all of us.

14 COMMENT: The Teche Vermillion is pumping water in St. Landry
15 Parish. It's holding 18-foot elevations. The only way of
16 getting rid of the water in case it rains in high water is
17 through the Grimmatt Canal. And I would like to find out
18 what is the story on that. I really don't know what's
19 happening, if there's more water in the basin than they have
20 now or if it everything was still the same. But my concern
21 is about the water when it gets too high in St. Landry
22 Parish.

24 NAME: Ray Brignac

25 COMMENT: I'm the retired executive director of the Teche

1 Vermillion Freshwater District, a Corps of Engineers
2 project, supplying freshwater to Bayou Teche and Bayou
3 Vermillion. I serve on the Atchafalaya levee work. I
4 served on the Atchafalaya Basin Program Research and
5 Promotion Board. I've been in water-related projects for 40
6 years. Public projects. Now, I happen to know that the
7 basin is dead. The water's dead. It doesn't move. Only in
8 the river it moves. The Corps of Engineers needs to build a
9 station, lift station, that lifts the water out of the
10 Atchafalaya River and put in there up north of the Basin
11 here a flow of water to constantly move water. Throughout
12 this whole Henderson Water Management Unit, they call it --
13 that's a false thing anyhow because they can't manage that
14 water. They don't have the authority. They can suggest
15 maybe. But this is a Corps of Engineer project with federal
16 funds. And the hydrilla cannot live where there's moving
17 water. The weirs don't do the job because they prevent the
18 fish from coming upstream through Bayou Benoit and that
19 whole area south. The fish have to get out of the
20 Atchafalaya River and come up there and the river doesn't
21 get high enough anymore for those fish to come up the
22 stream, get into the Basin, and get into the Henderson area,
23 and spawn. They don't. So there's no fishing. No fish.
24 So that's my statement. And they can publish it, they can
25 do what they want with it. I'm a friend of the Corps. I

1 know the general in Washington, DC. They're my friends.

2 But that's what they need.

3

4 NAME: James Choplin

5 COMMENT: Well, what I'm concerned about is if the Corps of

6 Engineers could do anything about dredging some of the small

7 channels between the left side and the right side of the

8 Atchafalaya Basin. These either block with trees and

9 everything, it hasn't been dredged in almost I'd say 30 or 50

10 years to get more fresh water into the Atchafalaya Basin.

11 One thing I'd like to see I think it might improve and get

12 more fresh water in and kill the hydrilla. We're not

13 getting enough fresh water in and we have all of these

14 channels, all of the these little canals, that are not

15 coming in and not being cleaned by the Corps. We need to set

16 a priority list where you can get the most water in the

17 fastest way. That's all I have to say.

20 Affiliation: Camp Atchafalaya , Kandew Unlimited

21 COMMENT: We brought a approximately 12 to 13 people to

22 this meeting to express to the Corps and to Tetra Tech that

23 we would like for the Corps and the Atchafalaya Basin

24 Program to start developing access to the basin from a

25 viewpoint of creating Universal Accessibility meaning access

1 for everyone, including people with disabilities. The law
2 requires it. And according to The Americans With
3 Disabilities Civil Rights Act, which was passed in 1990 by
4 Congress, approximately 70 percent of the American
5 population -- if you include their family and the people
6 that they are associated with -- we have over 50 percent of
7 the American population are concerned about Universal

13 to move forward. I sincerely appreciate the opportunity for

17 COMMENT: The first comment would be for Camp Atchafalaya.

18 It's a camp we'd like to see built for the people with
19 disabilities, a fully accessible facility in the Catahoula
20 area. We'd like to see that built along with a partnership
21 with state parks as one of the three permanent camp
22 facilities. On a different subject, I'd like to comment on
23 we'd like to see four-wheeler accessibility in the Indian
24 Bayou for pleasure riding. Pleasure riding with
25 four-wheelers in Indian Bayou. And the other thing I want

1 to make a comment on water control parts. We'd like to see
2 them put water in the Atchafalaya Basin using the Teche
3 Vermillion public station and the Bayou Courtableau west
4 control structure.

6 NAME: Mary L. Courville

7 COMMENT: I was just discussing that it would be good to
8 have a botanical gardens and bird sanctuary which would be
9 like an interpretive center which would be right near
10 Cypress Cove Landing on the opposite side of the levee, not
11 within the flood plane, but on the other side. We would
12 actually have a tourist attraction, you'd have a bird
13 sanctuary identifying all the different ducks that can be
14 hunted each year, teaching that hunting is a management
15 tool, you'd also have a children's garden, you'd have an
16 area that you can tour through to learn about the vegetation
17 of the Basin, all about the different things of the Basin,
18 the crops of Louisiana, just things like that. It would be
19 an educational interpretive center that would be used to
20 bring people to other parts of the Basin and let them know
21 what places they could go and do other things as well. As
22 well if they had only a short period of time they could
23 actually learn quite a bit about different things about
24 Louisiana as well as the Atchafalaya Basin and the birds of
25 Louisiana. I think it's important that we consider this

1 type of facility -- we just had a discussion -- that for
2 people that want to use other areas they won't know where
3 to go. We are familiar with the Basin, and again they're
4 places that we never get to see because there's not access.
5 So if you had a facility that people could go to learn more
6 about what's available, what's out there for them to do, and
7 what's safe for them to do, as well as what's educational,
8 what you could bring children, school children, classes. The
9 science classes are begging for something like this. It's
10 an opportunity for teachers to have field trips and it would
11 just be tremendous opportunity education wise, as well as a
12 tourist attraction. It would also add an asset to the town
13 of Henderson, the restaurants, the businesses would all be
14 benefited by the people coming in as tourists to come and
15 see the facility. So I just think it's a necessary thing to
16 do and they can feel free contact me. My cell number is
17 337-288-4594. We also are working on bringing Hooping Cranes
18 to be viewed as well, which is the rarest crane in the
19 world. So it would be a great asset for the Atchafalaya
20 Basin.

22 NAME: Art Courville

23 COMMENT: My recommendation is to remove the structure on
24 the lower side south of the Pontoon Bridge and allow the
25 lake to fill up and drain at a natural state. When I was

1 fishing there back in the 60s, and since then the lake has
2 gone down hill, and I think it's because it's not draining
3 naturally which it should. So south and north mounds will
4 dry up hard bottom for fish to spawn and possibly kill some
5 of the problems that we're having with the aquatic.

9 NAME:Linda Doucet

10 AFFILIATION: Camp Atchafalaya

11 COMMENT: I just wanted to say that I'm also a freelance
12 writer. And I'm very excited about getting back into this
13 program. I've been involved with the Atchafalaya program
14 since 1999, and it's very important to have this camp built.
15 And I want to make it more aware. I used to write about the
16 Atchafalaya railroads. And I think what we need with these
17 two storms that we had right between Rita and Katrina it's
18 really important that we make a recreation program to clean
19 up the Atchafalaya Basin to use as a tourist attraction.
20 We could bring money here in our state. It's very important
21 to make this aware and help people understand how important
22 it is. And that's all I have to say.

23

24 NAME: Mary Courville

25 COMMENT: I also recommend that we make sure that we

1 conserve the wild flowers that are naturally growing on the
2 levees and in different parts of the Atchafalaya Basin. As
3 the tourists come through, that's one of the features that
4 they are gonna ask questions about. We, right now, have a
5 few questions as to what's blooming where. And they want
6 identification. They want to know what it is. Many people,
7 when they get involved in ecotourism, that's one of the
8 things that's gonna bring emphasis imperatives to questions.

9 And so I recommend that we have a major program. And all
10 it takes is management. Conserving what is out there,
11 removing invasive species things that don't belong there,
12 and focusing on conserving what is natural to the
13 environment. It's not a hard process. It's moving seeds
14 around and removing some of the invasive species. But I
15 think that it is something that's imperative if you're
16 going to make tourist attraction or anything that's a good
17 natural environment. We need to conserve what's unique to
18 that region. So people don't need a sign to know they're at
19 the Atchafalaya Basin because its unique flowers will be
20 blooming and growing in that area. So it's something that I
21 think is important that we not forget that we do emphasize,
22 and we do that throughout the area of what we're gonna be
23 using as that attraction.

24

25 NAME: Jim Delahoussaye

1 COMMENT: The comment I'd like to make concerns the
2 placement of the interpretive center that the Corps is
3 interested in putting into the basin in the Henderson area
4 as a recreational, informational feature. Actually, at the
5 present time, I think that the plan calls for a major
6 interpretive center to be placed in Morgan City. The Butte
7 La Rose Welcome Center, which is located on Interstate 10,
8 as it crosses the Henderson management area is a much more
9 logical place to put the interpretive center just because
10 there's a huge number of people that actually stop there and
11 ask for information. That particular highway, Highway I-10
12 gets virtually all the traffic that's going east west cross
13 the southern United States and that would put this
14 interpretive center in the perfect place to be the most
15 effective in my opinion. So that's basically what I wanted
16 to say.

17

18 NAME: Cleve Bergeron

19 COMMENT: My background is I was a tour guide in the
20 Henderson area for many years. And a couple of problems I
21 seen with that the area. We don't have enough water flow
22 from north to south in the Atchafalaya/Henderson area. We
23 need more open bayous like Bayou Fordoche. Open dredge
24 cleaned up for trees so water can flow from the north to the
25 south of I-10 to Henderson and the main lake. Also, keep in

1 mind, the water flow all the way into Henderson Lake and
2 that's control structure that lets the water out. And also,
3 another point is this is all fresh, good water coming from
4 Courtableau. Another point I want to make about the water
5 flow is at proposed water from the Atchafalaya River which
6 I feel is a "no no" because the Atchafalaya River water up
7 above north of I-10 coming in would bring in sand and
8 siltation which is not good for this area at all. It's
9 preferably the river water comes in from the river down to
10 Catahoula and into Henderson as a back water. And again,
11 that controls structure along the levee could be adjusted to
12 let more water in and more water out as needed to keep the
13 water circulating in and out of Henderson. And, of course,
14 deep in the channels and in Henderson Lake and we need to
15 find a way to keep the hydrilla down which most of the time
16 just drain out in the winter months. And, of course, with
17 the drain down we need to make channels to access to all the
18 public and private boat landings which operate businesses
19 and tour operators in that area. Another point kind of
20 pertaining to the boat landing is there are people that
21 would like more accessible public boat landings along the
22 levee. I reject to that idea because if you put public boat
23 landings close to Henderson, it would draw too many of the
24 people away from the private boat landings. So I think the
25 private boat landings need to keep their businesses going so

1 private entities along their boat landings and boat rentals
2 and private landings could serve a big need and you wouldn't
3 be competing with these people and taking away from their
4 livelihood. Because these people rely on boat ramps, tour
5 boats, selling baits and what not to make their living. So
6 no public boat landings in this vicinity at all. And thank
7 you.

8

9 NAME: Glenn Hollier

10 COMMENT: The only thing I have is I think they need a
11 primitive campground at the Dixie Canal. That's in north of
12 Henderson.

6 NAME: Buck Vandersteen

7 AFFILIATION: Executive Director, Louisiana Forestry

8 Association

9 COMMENT: I appreciate the opportunity to comment on the

10 Henderson Water Management Unit. My comments are based on

11 how the investigators are viewing the private landowners in

12 these areas. And are they taking into affect or into

13 evaluation the affect that these recommendations would have

14 on current uses of the land and the opportunity for

15 landowners to continue to make a living on their property.

16 I'm also concerned about how this proposal will affect the

17 health of the forests within the Henderson Water Management

18 Unit. Particularly, if forest management, timber

19 harvesting, timber stand improvements, reforestation will be

20 part of the water management plan so that we ensure the

21 health and sustainability of forest resources within this

22 area. I'm also concerned with how activities will affect

23 employment opportunities of current uses. I know that

24 recreation is a key part of the plan and certainly there

25 will be employment opportunities with recreational

1 facilities, but we've seen that the income generated in
2 recreation opportunities does not compare at all with the
3 income generated from the use of these resources for forest
4 products or building material for other higher valued uses.
5 I'm also concerned with if this land is taken for public
6 use, it's taken out of the taxes roles of the local
7 communities. And how will the loss of that tax revenue be
8 replaced by the state or by the Federal Government that uses
9 that land for public purpose and not for current private
10 use?

11

12 NAME: Bradley Grimmatt

13 COMMENT: We are going to start with the Henderson
14 Management Unit. The weirs in the unit shouldn't be
15 released. Everything that goes into the Cocodrie and Bayou
16 Beouf watershed comes down and comes into Henderson. And
17 everything from Simmesport into within the Basin comes --
18 all the water comes down. With the weirs they have narrowed
19 it down. Water doesn't drain and it destroyed a lot of
20 farmers, put a lot of farmers out of business. And cost --
21 well cost the state a lot of money in crops and stuff. It
22 needs running water to have oxygen for the fish to survive.
23 On the east side of the lake, the southeast side, they
24 should put a set of gates that goes out into the river to
25 let freshwater in and out so that they'll have more oxygen

1 in the water and the fish can restock from the river better
2 than man can. And it should be held at around nine foot at
3 the most. Legally, they are supposed to keep it at seven.
4 To put freshwater in they need to bring it out of the river
5 and put it in Courtableau. And they can siphon over the
6 levee and the Courtableau will go to Fordoche come down.
7 They can siphon it out the same behind the Big Ofie bring it
8 down almost to the Dixie Pipeline Canal with this minor cut
9 will bring it into Dixie Pipeline Canal on the east side
10 which would put moving water in areas that the dead water
11 been. When they raided the weirs they killed a lot of the
12 trees, the forest. There were briars, in other words, brush
13 that was probably 7 to 8-foot tall and now just there's a water
14 mark. It destroyed a lot of area for the animals and the
15 timber. It's a good project, but everybody needs to work to
16 keep everyone happy and that they have to remember that the
17 water coming above floods down that they don't have a place
18 for it to come. And it's a spillway designed for the water
19 to flow to keep from drowning homes and people's houses.

20

21 NAME: Mayor, Willie Haynes

22 AFFILIATION: Mayor of Melville

23 COMMENT: I'm here this afternoon to see about getting a
24 boat landing for the town of Melville. I was informed that
25 with the new planning of the town of Melville there's

1 presently out of the range, but with the information that
2 was given to me tonight I can contact my Congressman which
3 is withstanding. And there is some wording that can be
4 placed to include the town of Melville on the program where
5 we could be one of the 15 boat launches established within
6 the 190-bound area. We're presently seeking this boat
7 landing because the landing will definitely increase tourism
8 for the town of Melville. It would increase the economy of
9 the town of Melville which is so desperately needed. It
10 would also provide easy access to the river for commercial as
11 well as the recreational fisherman. And last, but not
12 least, a boat ramp would unite the town of Melville and the
13 Atchafalaya River as part of each other's way of life. So
14 hopefully with the help of the congressman we will be on
15 that list to establish a boat ramp in the town of Melville.

16

17 NAME: Harold Schoeffler

18 COMMENT: First of all, we would hope that the Corps in
19 this process sets up a baseline study to evaluate the
20 present condition of the environment in Henderson Management
21 Unit. We would also hope that in dealing with that they
22 look at the aspect of monitoring water levels, the gauge
23 systems and so forth throughout the water management company
24 that exists today. That we would look at the historical
25 flow of the system and deal with restoring as much as

1 possible. We would hope that any dams that are presently in
2 the system would be totally removed so that the unit can
3 function as a system as it has done historically so that
4 shrimp and blue crab and eel and all these species that
5 migrate in and out of systems would not be prohibited by
6 some dam. We would hope that a thorough inventory of fish,
7 wildlife, and bird species be put in place. People that are
8 presently using it deal with the issue of botanical plants
9 that are there, historical plants that should be there like
10 Irises, cattails and so forth restore the Cypress and
11 opportunities are there to restore the cutover
12 Cypress-Tupelo Swamp and get the Cypress replaced. Try to,
13 as much as possible, to enhance the forestry the forests
14 that are there today. I think that it's important that the
15 water quality is monitored not in terms only of level but of
16 height of oxygen content, sediment, and hazardous materials.
17 The need to deal with the drilling of many, many oil and gas
18 wells and the dumping of the cuttings and produced waters
19 and the impact of that. The impact of leaving behind pilings
20 of creosote, pipelines, that are called flowlines, that are
21 left behind throughout the system rusting and they still
22 contain oil residue to be put in the system. The issue of
23 spoil banks left by the pipelines, and the negative impact
24 on flows. All that to be dealt with to reestablish the
25 historical environment of that ecosystem.

2 NAME: JoAnn Fryling

3 COMMENT: Okay. My concern is getting more Cypress Tupelo
4 forest into public access. Whether, I don't know, whether
5 it could be purchased or whether we just get easements. I am
6 very concerned about the Cypress mulch problem in Louisiana.
7 I don't want to see the Cypress in our Atchafalaya Basin
8 being turned into Cypress mulch. And I would like whenever
9 there is the cap raised so that more money can -- is
10 available for purchasing property within the Atchafalaya, I
11 would like to see it be Cypress Tupelo, and no more hunting.
12 We don't have enough public Cypress Tupelo Swamp.

NAME: Sue G. Herbert

25

COMMENT: We own a preservation group, but we need to

1 preserve the Bayou Sorrel Indian mound, which is located up
2 in the levees. This mound was investigated in 1902 by
3 prominent archeologists, and now we have a regional
4 archeologist who will be looking at this mound. And when
5 all the drillings and showing how to determine the age of
6 the mound because we know that in 1902 there were a number
7 of different tribal artifacts have been found. But now we
8 think that since the Chitmachas were here 6,000 years ago
9 and Indian tribes were in Louisiana 12,000 years ago, we are
10 looking forward to seeing how old that mound is, which would
11 mean if the Corps drilling would show how deep does the
12 mound go. If the mound is shallow as it seems to be from
13 the original investigation was not a deep type thing. Well
14 then that mound could be much older than say 2500 years.
15 Our concern is the water rises every spring that I know of
16 and maybe another time when too much water or too much snow
17 comes down. And it's gradually deteriorating this mound.
18 And we know that in Louisiana there was no fight or purchase
19 from the Indians to gain Louisiana. So these Indians should
20 be preserved or whatever. This mound also has people of the
21 Atchafalaya Basin after the flood of 27' came a burial found
22 to some of the people who had to leave the Atchafalaya
23 Basin. And we think that as the Indians are prehistory in
24 some of them that someday the people of the Basin people be
25 digging us up in 100 years from now. What did they do? We

1 think it has a double hit for having a mote or concrete mote
2 or something around it and preserving it and giving it
3 national historic preservation nomination of some type.
4 Right now the mound is protected in a sense of Federal
5 Government. It says you can not dig Indian artifacts up.
6 We're not worried too much about that now. But we want the
7 distinction and to save that mound from deteriorating
8 gradually. By the rise and fall of the Atchafalaya Basin.

9

10 NAME: Alvin Allen

11 Comment: I was just wondering what impact this recreation
12 is gonna have on the commercial management. Like this has
13 been a way of life for him. He don't have no good job.
14 He's been depending on the Basin for a living. I was just
15 wondering how this recreation was gonna affect him. I'm
16 glad the country's okay and people have money to spend on
17 recreation. But this country was founded on hard work and
18 all that, recreation and good times. And the people around
19 here, they literally think the Corps of Engineers is a bad
20 area. They see it in everything they have messed up. I
21 know a man that was in the Basin. Hasn't went to school but
22 six weeks in his life. What was gonna happen if they done
23 this, you don't know what you're talking about. It happens,
24 you know. But that basin is a way of life to some people you
25 know. And the government is just taking it away from them.

1 That's all I got to say.

2

3 NAME: Flo Emplet

4 Comment: What I'm really interested in is the cemetery out
5 there because my grandparents are buried out there. But
6 they had a huge Methodist church out. Bank of it and that's
7 where a lot of our relatives are buried and we have probably
8 about 12 feet of sands over it now. So I would like to see
9 them go out and clean the sand off and either raise up the
10 headstones or do something, you know, to it so we know where
11 our grandparents are. And another thing, I'm interested in
12 trying to get water out into the Basin the way it used to be
13 when we lived out there. When they cut that Wax Lake
14 cutover in St. Mary Parish, well they should have put either
15 locks or something to keep the water from going out to the
16 gulf so fast. Because now you can't have water in the Basin
17 because it all goes out Wax Lake cut because it's a big
18 current, a lot of current, and it just, you know, the water
19 goes out fast. And I'd like to see them get water into the
20 Basin for the commercial fishermen because they need, you
21 know, more water to keep crawfish and crabs and fish.
