Duties:

- ◆ Analyzes program changes, transactions, and their effect on the assets, liabilities, and equities of the general ledger.

Minimum Qualification Requirements:

- ◆ Bachelor's or higher degree in accounting; or a degree in a related field such as business administration, finance, or public administration that included or was supplemented by 24 semester hours in accounting.
- Or
- ◆ Combination of education and experience: at least 4 years of experience in accounting, or an equivalent combination of accounting experience, college-level education, and training that provided professional accounting knowledge.

Specialized Experience Required:

- ◆ One year of specialized experience which includes 1) Utilizing Generally Accepted Accounting Principles (GAAP) to provide professional accounting services and advice related to interpreting and evaluating accounting and financial data; 2) Tracking, analyzing, and reporting on financial activities; 3) Monitoring the effectiveness of internal accounting controls and systems; 4) Preparing accounting and financial statements and reports; or 5) Analyzing and reconciling reports for accuracy.
