Dear Mr. Zeringue:

This concerns your enclosed communication dated July 7, 2010, relative to your request for an amendment of your emergency authorization to sling load an additional (2000 sandbags) within designated breach sites, off of Pelican Island and Scofield Island, near Empire, Louisiana, within Plaquemines Parish; all as part of mitigating effects of oil from the MC252 (Deepwater Horizon) oil spill.

We have reviewed your request and find that the work qualifies under (General Permit) NOD-20 for emergency operations, as long as all conditions of this permit are met. This authorization does not obviate you from acquiring a Louisiana Coastal Use Permit or any other federal, state, or local approvals that may be required by law.

The following conditions are maintained as a part of this emergency authorization amendment:

- 1. The authorized activities shall be done in accordance with your request and performed in a manner that will avoid adverse impacts to the environment and aquatic resources, to the maximum extent practicable.
- 2. Material utilized within the sand bags shall be free of contaminants and come from a non-wetland location and/or a previously authorized site.
- 3. Permittee shall insure sand bags are cut, removed and disposed of in an environmentally acceptable manner as soon as practicable to insure that all sand bags have been removed prior to construction of proposed restoration projects within this vicinity. Permittee shall coordinate with Ms. Rachel Sweeney Service, with NOAA's, National Marine Fisheries on the timing of sand bag removal to insure construction schedules for the restoration projects are not impacted.





- 4. Permittee shall monitor the areas where sand bags are placed to determine if increased erosion is realized at these locations. If increased levels of erosion are recognized, appropriate, environmentally acceptable methods should be taken to degrade and stabilize these areas to minimize such impacts. Such monitoring should be done on a regular basis until final recommendations are made through your after-the-fact permit application evaluation.
- 5. Mechanized land clearing or filling of wetlands for staging areas is not authorized, unless expressly identified within the enclosed plans.
- 6. Permittee shall have a third party biologist on site to document the presence, or lack thereof, of nesting birds and whether the work results in nest abandonment.

This approval is subject to the terms and conditions of (General Permit) NOD-20, dated September 13, 2007, a copy of which is enclosed. Please note that a formal permit application and drawings must be submitted within the time limits stated in the attached general permit.

Your project is located within the Louisiana Coastal Zone, as such your formal permit application submittal must be sent through the Louisiana Department of Natural Resources. Should you require information on submitting your application through their office, please contact Mr. Karl Morgan at





Description: Proposed filling of fourteen (14) breaches on Pelican and Scofield Islands to prevent the advancing oil spill from the BP Horizon from entering the inside bay areas to protect wildlife and wetlands. This Amended Emergency Use Authorization supersedes the original Emergency Use Authorization which was issued May 14, 2010.

Dear Mr. Nungesser:

We have reviewed the information presented to the Office of Coastal Management (OCM) in your Emergency Use Authorization request dated July 7, 2010. Pursuant to the provisions contained in the LAC (Title 43, Part I, Chapter 7 •723.B.3.), the Emergency Use Authorization request is hereby granted. This Emergency Use Authorization provides only for that work

necessary to accomplish the above referenced purpose and is contingent upon acceptance of the following conditions.

- 1. This Emergency Use Authorization is strictly limited to the activity as described in your request and accompanying plats.
- 2. Dredge and fill activities for site access is not authorized unless specifically described in the work statement of this letter.
- 3. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to submit to OCM, a complete application packet (\$100 application fee, Joint Application Form, vicinity plats, plan plats, cross section plats, etc.) for the activity not more than thirty (30) days from the date of this authorization. You may obtain a free application packet by calling our office at (225) 342-7591 or (800)-267-4019; or by visiting our website at http://www.dnr.state.la.us/crm/coastmgt/cup/cup.asp.
- 4. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to avoid to the maximum extent practicable, vegetated wetland impacts, and if necessary to mitigate for those unavoidable adverse impacts to vegetated wetlands, including submerged aquatics, should OCM determine that mitigation is necessary. Should OCM deem mitigation to be necessary, the applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to submit and fulfill a mitigation plan that has been approved by OCM.
- 5. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to adjust, alter, or remove any structure or other evidence of the authorized emergency use if, in the opinion of OCM, it proves to be beyond the scope of the authorized activity or is abandoned.
- 6. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to hold and save the State of Louisiana, the Department of Natural Resources (DNR), and their officers and employees harmless from any damage to persons or property which might result from the emergency use.
- 7. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to certify that the emergency use has been completed in an acceptable and satisfactory manner and in accordance with the plans and specifications approved by OCM as referenced herein. OCM may, when appropriate, require such certification by given by a registered engineer.

- 8. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to ensure that this Emergency Use Authorization, or a copy thereof, shall be available for inspection at the work site at all times during operations.
- 9. The applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of authorized activities, to notify OCM of the date on which initiation of the authorized emergency activity began. The applicant shall notify OCM by mailing the enclosed green initiation card on the date of initiation of the authorized activities.
- 10. The area where the project is located is all part of the aboriginal homelands of the Chitimacha Tribe of Louisiana. As such, large villages, burial sites, and sacred sites were in place in that entire area. If at any time during the course of the work, any traditional cultural properties are discovered, Permittee shall immediately contact Kimberly S. Walden (Cultural Director) or Melanie Aymond (Research Coordinator) at Cultural Director) or Melanie Aymond (Research Coordinator) at Company of the form 7:30 A.M. 5:00 P.M. and on Friday between 7:30 A.M. 11:30 A.M. If traditional cultural properties are discovered on the weekend or after business hours, the notification shall be made the next business morning.
- 11. The sand utilized in this project shall be free of contamination and suitable for use in coastal restoration projects.
- 12. Sand bags and slings should be constructed of benign materials and in such a manner that they do/will not pose a threat to fish and wildlife (e.g. birds, marine mammals, turtles, etc.) through entanglement, ingestion, entrapment, etc. A review of the Louisiana Natural Heritage Database indicates that several rare species and natural communities are known to occur in the area. These species and communities include sea grass beds, coastal mangroves, manatees, diamondback terrapin, sea turtles and wading birds.
- 13. Applicant agrees, by virtue of the commencement of repair activities, to notify each oyster lease holder within 500 feet affected prior to commencement of the proposed activity.
- 14. In order to ensure the safety of all parties, the permittee shall contact the Louisiana One Call System (1-800-272-3020) a minimum of 48 hours prior to the commencement of any excavation (digging, dredging, jetting, etc.) or demolition activity.

- 15. Prior to commencement of the Pelican and Scofield Island restoration projects, applicant agrees to coordinate with the project sponsors (Office of Coastal Protection and Restoration OCPR and the National Marine Fisheries Service Habitat Conservation Division NMFS) the cutting, removal and disposal of the bags (and sand, if contaminated with any hydrocarbon material) in accordance with State and Federal requirements prior to construction of either of these restoration projects. The timing for removal should be coordinated with the NMFS in a manner to ensure construction schedules for the restoration projects are not impacted.
- 16. Unless otherwise specified, this Emergency Use Authorization will expire 30 days from the date of this letter, if the work has not been initiated or if the applicant has not submitted a complete Coastal Use Permit Application to OCM for the authorized activity. This expiration condition will be waived only if the applicant notifies OCM of the reason(s) for the delay and proposes an acceptable schedule for initiation of the work, or submits a complete Coastal Use Permit Application.
- 17. This authorization is not valid unless the applicant agrees to the terms and conditions provided for herein by executing in the space provided below.

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


